- Thank you for the opportunity to testify on an issue I believe is of great importance to Vermonters' trust in their government an independent ethics commission.
- As an advocate for transparency in government, I am convinced it is time for Vermont to join the 47 other states in creating a body to set standards and oversee ethics in state government.
- Let me begin by saying, by and large, we are served well by our dedicated public servants at the state, and local levels of gov't.
- The vast majority of our elected state and local officials are trustworthy, dedicated and passionate individuals who want to do the right thing.
- However, corruption does exist, and in small doses it can be just as corrosive to our democracy as any prominent scandal, undermining the public trust.
- Vermonters deserve good government and the only way that can happen is if the public has access to an open, transparent government.
- I believe the time has come when VT must enact clear laws regarding ethics, conflicts of interest and financial disclosure.
- Three pillars are needed:
 - Independence
 - \circ Authority
 - Resources
- I am pleased to see the Senate pass an ethics bill with important steps forward on the revolving door, financial disclosure and pay-to-play provisions, but I fear it does not go far enough.
- The commission they propose is not *independent*, it does not have enforcement *authority* and is not adequately *resourced*.

- The Senate proposal as crafted lacks teeth and without some small investment in resources, it is destined to fail.

- Vermont is consistently toward the bottom of many state rankings when it comes to government transparency, accountability and integrity.
- All Northeast States ME, MA, NH, RI, CT, NY, NJ, PA except VT have an Ethics Commission
- VT should create an INDEPENDENT Ethics Commission
- The Commission must have the AUTHORITY to INVESTIGATE, SUBPOENA and ENFORCE
- <u>The Commission should at the very least have a FULL TIME executive</u> <u>director and two additional staff to support administration, education,</u> <u>investigation and prosecution.</u>

- Those who oppose an ethics commission talk about it:
 - being too expensive OR
 - I suggest that we simply cannot afford NOT to invest in an ethics commission.
 - It will pay for itself by preventing corruption, conflicts, and increased accountability while improving public trust.
 - VT is so small and we know everyone
 - Corruption can start small before leading to bigger issues
 - Sometimes the issues seem benign
- Let me end by saying again, we are generally well served by our dedicated public servants.
- But we see the examples of conflicts and ethical dilemmas every day.
- We hear the complaints from our citizens and we have a statewide perspective few people can appreciate. Chris will speak briefly to that.
- Thank you for your time today and for the careful consideration I know you will give this very important subject.
