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


### **ACOs and SSPs**

- Accountable Care Organizations (ACOs) are composed of and led by health care providers who have agreed to work together and be accountable for the cost and quality of care for a defined population
- Shared Savings Programs (SSPs), precursors to the All-Payer Model, are payment reform initiatives developed by health care payers. SSPs are offered to providers (e.g., ACOs) who agree to participate with the payers to:
  - Promote accountability for a defined population
  - Coordinate care
  - Encourage investment in infrastructure and care processes
  - Share a percentage of savings realized as a result of their efforts
- Participation in ACOs and SSPs is voluntary




#### **Shared Savings Calculated Annually**

## **Shared Savings Program Standards**

- Shared Savings Program standards in Vermont were developed as a result of collaboration among payers, providers, consumer representatives, and other stakeholders, facilitated by the State.
- ACO SSP standards include:
  - Attribution of Patients
  - Establishment of Expenditure Targets
  - Distribution of Savings
  - Impact of Performance Measures on Savings Distribution
  - Governance
