renewal licenses; and

process to enable the identification of the ownership, controlling, and
management interests in both the real estate and operations components of the
nursing home.
(ded) Assistance. The Working Group shall have the administrative,
technical, and legal assistance of the Department of Disabilities, Aging, and
Independent Living and the Division of Rate Setting.
(efe) Report. On or before January 15, 2019, the Working Group shall
submit a written report to House Committee on Human Services and the Senate
Committee on Health and Welfare that includes its findings and any
recommendations for legislative action. The report shall include proposed
legislation and implementation schedule as well identify any staffing or
financial resources necessary for implementation.
Sec. 2. 18 V.S.A. § 9434 is amended to read:
§ 9434. CERTIFICATE OF NEED; GENERAL RULES
(a) A health care facility other than a hospital shall not develop or have
developed on its behalf a new health care project without issuance of a
certificate of need by the Board. For purposes of this subsection, a "new
health care project" includes the following:
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1	(3) The offering of any home health service, or the transfer or
2	conveyance of more than a 50 percent ownership interest in a health care
3	facility other than a hospital or nursing home.
