Re: Impact of Proposed Legislation S.105

Chair Grad and Members of the House Committee on Judiciary,

We write today to express our opposition to S.105 – An act relating to consumer justice enforcement - which is currently being considered by the House Committee on Judiciary.

S.105 would be disruptive, burdensome to the courts and is unnecessary. By manipulating the judicial inquiry into the unconscionable nature of a contract provision with a new rigid test, the bill would disrupt the usual judicial process, which is to evaluate whether a particular provision is unconscionable on a case by case basis.

The courts have a long tradition of handling such cases and know how to evaluate contracts for unconscionable provisions and there is no evidence that they are not doing this properly. To the extent that the law is aimed at curbing arbitration agreements, the hostility to arbitration is unfounded. Arbitration benefits consumers and businesses, and the major arbitration organizations have rules and processes that provide protections for consumer (such as prohibiting unreasonable fees and inconvenient forums). Arbitration is more efficient, faster, and less costly for businesses and consumers alike when compared to jury trials. If enacted into law, this law would make it harder for individuals and business to vindicate their legal rights.

We urge you to oppose this bill. Thank you for your consideration.
