12	(a)(1) On or before January 1, 2016, the Criminal Justice Training Council,
13	in consultation with stakeholders, including the Vermont League of Cities and
14	Towns, the Vermont Human Rights Commission, and Migrant Justice, shall
15	create a model fair and impartial policing policy. On or before July 1, 2016
16	January 15, 2018, every State, local, county, and municipal law enforcement
17	agency and every constable who exercises law enforcement authority pursuant

to 24 V.S.A. § 1936a and who is trained in compliance with section 2358 of

this title shall adopt a fair and impartial policing policy that includes, at a

- (2) On or before October 1, 2018, and every even-numbered year thereafter, the Criminal Justice Training Council, in consultation with the Attorney General and the Human Rights Commission, shall review and, if necessary, update the model fair and impartial policing policy.

 review and make necessary amendments to the policy of any law enforcement

 agency or constable that is required to adopt a policy pursuant to subsection (a)

 of this section that does not adopt the Criminal Justice Training Council model

 policy. fails to do so on or before July 1, 2016, that agency or constable shall

 be deemed to have adopted, and shall follow and enforce, the model policy

 issued by the Criminal Justice Training Council.
- (c) On or before September 15, 2014, and annually thereafter Annually, as part of their annual training report to the Council, every State, county, and municipal law enforcement agency and every constable who exercises law enforcement authority pursuant to 24 V.S.A. § 1936a and who is trained in compliance with section 2358 of this title shall report to the Council whether the agency or officer has adopted a the fair and impartial policing policy in accordance with subsections subsection (a) and (b) of this section. The

2	annual certification of training requirements, whether current officers have
3	received training on fair and impartial policing as required by 20 V.S.A.

7	Senate Committees on Judiciary which departments and officers have adopted
