RE: VTFSC Opposition to H.591

TO: Members of the Natural Resources, Fish & Wildlife Committee

The Vermont Federation of Sportsmen Clubs (VTFSC) is an association that has existed in some form since 1875, and we represent 51 member clubs with well over 11,000 members. These clubs are primarily Fish & Game clubs, or are otherwise clubs that are geared towards outdoor sporting interests.

We wish to convey to the Committee our strong opposition to H.591, and request that the Committee listen to the stance of the Vermont Department of Fish & Wildlife whose position we support.

The Federation does not want to have Dingle-Johnson and/or Pittman-Robertson funds that Vermont receives from the Federal Government in any way endangered or jeopardized for potential violation of the use requirements that are coupled to these funds.

For your information, Vermont has received \$21,185,786 in Pittman-Robertson funds in the past five years, and Vermont also received \$17,426,495 in Dingle-Johnson funds for the same period, of which \$2,613,794 <u>was designated for boating access</u>.

In addition to the revenues from Vermont Hunting (in all forms) and fishing licenses and permits, in just the past 5 years Vermont has received Federal money from Pittman-Robertson and Dingle-Johnson excise fess that total \$38,612,281.

Fish & Wildlife has already clearly posted the priority of use at Boating Accesses, and this prioritization favors those who have paid their hard-earned money for sporting licenses, fees and excise taxes - so it makes a great deal of sense to us that these same citizens should have some simple priority over those that pay nothing - while still allowing use by non-payers. It is unconscionable to consider non-payers as having an equal or even greater priority than those who do pay.

We respectfully request that the Committee listen to the recommendations of the Fish & Wildlife Department on this matter, which is the same position advocated by the Federation.
