Dear Members of the House and Senate Appropriations Committees,

As the director of Otter Creek Child Center, in Middlebury, I'm writing to you today to *Please support allocating \$320,000 in the FY19 Department for Children and Families budget to sustain the current level of support that TEACH currently provides early care and education professionals seeking degrees and credentials.*

Since the beginning of TEACH in Vermont Otter Creek has been involved with the scholarship program with huge success. We currently have 2 teachers accessing the program to achieve Associates Degrees in Early Childhood Education. In the past we had 1 other teacher access the program for her A.A. in Early Childhood Education and another access the program while she was taking classes through the Vermont Higher Ed Collaborative in order to be eligible for an Early Childhood teaching license through Peer Review.

In all cases, TEACH, has allowed for our teachers to pursue higher education when they otherwise would not have been able to afford it. We love the TEACH program and here is why:
