Background:

My name is Crista Yagjian. I live in Guilford, Vermont. I am a licensed special educator and reading specialist who has worked with elementary-aged students for over fifteen years. As part of my work, I have participated in many school initiatives and committees. I have been a standing EST (education support team) member, an active school leadership team member, and a school leader as part of our district's involvement with SWIFT (School-Wide, Integrated, Framework for Transformation). I am also parent to a vivacious 9 year old son named Nate.

Concerns:

- It isn't clear that this opportunity is a way to improve education for *all* students rather than primarily being a cost saving measure.
- My worry is that this flexibility in funding could over-burden the teachers required by law to meet the needs of students identified as needing special education. We don't want to "water down" specialized instruction.
- Schools at the local levels need the capacity (financial capacity) to implement the recommendations in the DMG report. Targeted technical assistance from the AOE won't be enough. What I hear from my colleagues is that they need money for interventionists, flexible funding for professional development, and funding to get curricula resources.
- An advisory group has to include parents and teachers.
- There needs to be a bigger conversation about how we get our students the mental health supports they need.
- There needs to be a system for evaluating equity of resources across districts (How to do you ensure equity in students' educational experiences in our state?) The reality of the small school's constraints are real.

Hopes:

- Slow this process down -Please don't leave my child behind.
- Strengthen education quality- Know the reality of providing "rigorous gen ed"
- Focus on the process for establishing effective service delivery models Give us time to build our houses, starting with our "foundations."
- Establish a process for continuing to get input from "those on the ground."
