14	(1) Unless the sending and receiving schools agree to a different
15	arrangement, no tuition or other cost shall be charged by the receiving district
16	or paid by the sending district for a sending school district shall pay tuition for
17	each student transferring to a different high school under this section;
18	provided, however, a pursuant to subsection 824(b) of this title. In addition,
19	the sending high school district shall pay special education and career technical
20	education costs for resident students pursuant to the provisions of this title.

1	(2) A student transferring to a different high school under this section
2	shall pay no tuition, fee, or other cost that is not also paid by students residing
3	in the receiving district.
4	(3) A district of residence shall include within its average daily
5	membership any student who transfers to another high school under this
6	section; a receiving school district shall not include any student who transfers
7	to it under this section.

11	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2017 and shall apply to enrollments in
