Work Readiness Program

Using a nationally recognized job skills assessment system, the Work Readiness Program has three integrated components:

Exploring Careers is a system which allows the identification of a career path taking into account an individual's interests and local and national trends. Skill requirements for the career path are identified using a national employment database.

Career Ready 101 is an internet-based training system designed specifically for the development of job skills and work readiness.

WorkKeys is a job skills assessment system which measures "real world" skills employers believe are critical to job success. The WorkKeys assessment can lead to a National Career Readiness Certificate (NCRC), recognized by employers across the nation.

Your Steps to Success



In order to meet education and career goals, **Vermont Adult Learning (VAL)**provides students with individualized planning and goal setting.

Students work with an educational advisor to design a personalized learning plan.

Here are the steps VAL students follow to success:

Enrollment and Assessment

Enrollment gives potential students an overview of programs and guidelines. The assessment process helps measure current skill levels, including literacy (reading and writing), math computation, and applied math.

Personalized Learning Plan

The educational advisor reviews required subject areas with students and helps to design a study plan based on the needs and interests of each student.

Instruction and Achievement

Based on the personalized learning plan, instructional options are discussed and then assigned. Teachers work closely with students to assure personal learning goals are met.

Completion and Transition

From the day a student walks through our door, our staff begins a conversation about moving through the adult education system as well as life after course completion. Transition goals range from mastering basic skills, to earning a high school diploma, to preparing for college or technical training, to getting a better job.

Educational Program Descriptions

High School Completion Program



The High School Completion Program (HSCP) provides an individualized course of study so that adults earn a high school diploma from their local high school.

In order to qualify for the program, students must be at least 16 years old and meet academic skill assessment levels. There is no upper age limit.

Graduation education plans are designed so that when completed, graduates are ready for the next steps in their lives—enhanced employment opportunities, further training, or college.
