13	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
14	Sec. 1. 30 V.S.A. § 248(a) is amended to read:
15	(a)(1) No company, as defined in section 201 of this title, may:
16	* * *
17	(2) Except for the replacement of existing facilities with equivalent
18	facilities in the usual course of business, and except for electric generation
19	facilities that are operated solely for on-site electricity consumption by the
20	owner of those facilities and for hydroelectric generation facilities subject to

1	licensing jurisdiction under the Federal Power Act, 16 U.S.C. chapter 12,
2	subchapter 1:
3	(A) no company, as defined in section 201 of this title, and no person,
4	as defined in 10 V.S.A. § 6001(14), may begin site preparation for or
5	construction of an electric generation facility or electric transmission facility
6	within the State which is designed for immediate or eventual operation at any
7	voltage; and
8	(B) no such company may exercise the right of eminent domain in
9	connection with site preparation for or construction of any such transmission or
10	generation facility, unless the Public Service Board first finds that the same
11	will promote the general good of the State and issues a certificate to that effect.
12	In determining whether an electric generation facility promotes the general
13	good of the State, the Board shall give precedence to direct impacts from the
14	facility occurring within the State over indirect benefits based on the facility's
15	effect outside the State, such as the mix of generation resources connected to
16	the New England transmission system.
