1	TO THE HONORABLE SENATE:
2	The Committee on Government Operations to which was referred House
3	Bill No. 771 entitled "An act relating to the Vermont National Guard"
4	respectfully reports that it has considered the same and recommends that the
5	Senate propose to the House that the bill be amended by striking out all after
6	the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
7	Sec. 1. 20 V.S.A. § 428 is added to read:
8	§ 428. RECRUITMENT, RETENTION, AND PROMOTION OF WOMEN;
9	<u>REPORT</u>
10	(a) Notwithstanding 2 V.S.A. § 20(d), the Adjutant and Inspector General
11	shall make a report to the General Assembly on or before January 15, 2019 and
12	annually thereafter regarding the Vermont National Guard's efforts to recruit
13	and retain women and to increase the number of women serving as senior
14	noncommissioned officers, warrant officers, and senior commissioned officers.
15	(b) The report shall contain:
16	(1) the numbers of men and women serving in the Vermont National
17	Guard;
18	(2) the numbers, by rank, of men and women serving in the Vermont
19	National Guard as senior noncommissioned officers, E-7 and above; as warrant
20	officers, W-1 to W-5; and as senior commissioned officers, O-4 and above;

1	(3) the change during the previous five years in the numbers of men and
2	women serving in the Vermont National Guard as senior noncommissioned
3	officers, E-7 and above; as warrant officers, W-1 to W-5; and as senior
4	commissioned officers, O-4 and above;
5	(4) the numbers of men and women recruited to serve in the Vermont
6	National Guard during the past calendar year;
7	(5) the numbers of men and women recruited or promoted to serve in the
8	Vermont National Guard as senior noncommissioned officers, E-7 and above,
9	during the past calendar year;
10	(6) the numbers of men and women recruited or promoted to serve in the
11	Vermont National Guard as warrant officers, W-1 to W-5, during the past
12	calendar year;
13	(7) the numbers of men and women recruited or promoted to serve in the
14	Vermont National Guard as senior commissioned officers, O-4 and above,
15	during the past calendar year;
16	(8) a summary of the current policies, initiatives, and programs to
17	increase the number of women recruited and retained by the Vermont National
18	Guard, any changes made by the Guard since the prior report, and any
19	recommendations for legislative action to increase further the number of
20	women recruited and retained by the Vermont National Guard; and

1	(9) a summary of the current policies, initiatives, and programs to
2	increase the number of women serving in the Vermont National Guard as
3	senior noncommissioned officers, warrant officers, and senior commissioned
4	officers; any changes made by the Guard since the prior report; and any
5	recommendations for legislative action to increase further the number of
6	women serving in the Vermont National Guard as senior noncommissioned
7	officers, warrant officers, and senior commissioned officers.
8	Sec. 2. 2 V.S.A. § 12 is amended to read:
9	§ 12. LEGISLATIVE ELECTIONS; UNIFORM BALLOTS
10	(a) Whenever there is a known contested election for Speaker of the House
11	of Representatives, or for President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and in
12	elections by the joint assembly of the Legislature General Assembly, the
13	Secretary of State shall prepare a ballot for each office, listing the names of the
14	known candidates for the office in the alphabetical order of their surnames and
15	leaving thereon sufficient blank spaces to take care of any nominations from
16	the floor.
17	(b) A candidate for office shall, not later than one week preceding the
18	election, notify the Secretary of State in writing of his or her candidacy,
19	naming the particular office. If he or she fails so to notify the Secretary of
20	State, his or her name shall not be printed on the ballot. No ballot may be used
21	other than the official ballot provided by the Secretary of State.

1	(c)(1) A candidate for Adjutant and Inspector General shall:
2	(A) be a resident of Vermont;
3	(B) have attained the rank of lieutenant colonel (O-5) or above;
4	(C) be a current member of the U.S. Army, the U.S. Air Force, the
5	U.S. Army Reserve, the U.S. Air Force Reserve, the Army National Guard, or
6	the Air National Guard or be eligible to return to active service in the Army
7	National Guard or the Air National Guard; and
8	(D) be a graduate of a Senior Service College, currently be enrolled
9	in a Senior Service College, or be eligible to be enrolled in a Senior Service
10	College during the biennium in which the candidate would first be appointed.
11	(2) A candidate for Adjutant and Inspector General shall, at the time he
12	or she notifies the Secretary of State of his or her candidacy pursuant to
13	subsection (b) of this section, certify under oath to the Secretary that he or she
14	meets the qualifications set forth in subdivision (1) of this subsection.
15	Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE
16	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
