1	TO THE HONORABLE SENATE:
2	The Committee on Health and Welfare to which was referred Senate Bill
3	No. 50 entitled "An act relating to insurance coverage for telemedicine
4	services delivered in or outside a health care facility" respectfully reports that
5	it has considered the same and recommends that the bill be amended by
б	striking out Sec. 1 in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof a new Sec. 1 to
7	read as follows:
8	Sec. 1. 8 V.S.A. § 4100k is amended to read:
9	§ 4100k. COVERAGE OF TELEMEDICINE SERVICES
10	(a) All health insurance plans in this State shall provide coverage for
11	telemedicine services delivered by a health care provider at a distant site to a
12	patient in <u>or outside</u> a health care facility at an originating site to the same
13	extent that the services would be covered if they were provided through in-
14	person consultation.
15	(b) A health insurance plan may charge a deductible, co-payment, or
16	coinsurance for a health care service provided through telemedicine so long as
17	it does not exceed the deductible, co-payment, or coinsurance applicable to an
18	in-person consultation.
19	(c) A health insurance plan may limit coverage to health care providers in
20	the plan's network and may require originating site health care providers to
21	document the reason the services are being provided by telemedicine rather

1	than in person. A health insurance plan shall not impose limitations on the
2	number of telemedicine consultations a covered person may receive that
3	exceed limitations otherwise placed on in-person covered services.
4	(d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit a health insurance
5	plan from providing coverage for only those services that are medically
6	necessary, subject to the terms and conditions of the covered person's policy.
7	(e) A health insurance plan may reimburse for teleophthalmology or
8	teledermatology provided by store and forward means and may require the
9	distant site health care provider to document the reason the services are being
10	provided by store and forward means.
11	(f) Nothing in this section shall be construed to require a health insurance
12	plan to reimburse the distant site health care provider if the distant site health
13	care provider has insufficient information to render an opinion.
14	(g) In order to facilitate the use of telemedicine in treating substance use
15	disorder, health insurers and the Department of Vermont Health Access shall
16	ensure that both the treating clinician and the hosting facility are reimbursed
17	for the services rendered, unless the health care providers at both the host and
18	service sites are employed by the same entity.
19	(h) As used in this subchapter:

1	(1) <u>"Distant site" means the location of the health care provider</u>
2	delivering services through telemedicine at the time the services are
3	provided.
4	(2) "Health insurance plan" means any health insurance policy or health
5	benefit plan offered by a health insurer, as defined in 18 V.S.A. § 9402, as well
6	as Medicaid and any other public health care assistance program offered or
7	administered by the State or by any subdivision or instrumentality of the State.
8	The term does not include policies or plans providing coverage for specified
9	disease or other limited benefit coverage.
10	(2)(3) "Health care facility" shall have the same meaning as in 18
11	V.S.A. § 9402.
12	(3)(4) "Health care provider" means:
13	(A) a physician licensed pursuant to 26 V.S.A. chapter 23 or 33;
14	(B) a naturopathic physician licensed pursuant to 26 V.S.A.
15	<u>chapter 81;</u>
16	(C) an advanced practice registered nurse licensed pursuant to
17	26 V.S.A. chapter 28, subchapter 3;
18	(D) a physician assistant licensed pursuant to 26 V.S.A. chapter 31;
19	(E) a psychologist licensed pursuant to 26 V.S.A. chapter 55;
20	(F) a social worker licensed pursuant to 26 V.S.A. chapter 61;

1	(G) an alcohol and drug abuse counselor licensed pursuant to
2	<u>26 V.S.A. chapter 62;</u>
3	(H) a clinical mental health counselor licensed pursuant to 26 V.S.A.
4	chapter 65:
5	(I) a marriage and family therapist licensed pursuant to 26 V.S.A.
6	chapter 76;
7	(J) a psychoanalyst licensed pursuant to 26 V.S.A. chapter 77;
8	(K) a physical therapist licensed pursuant to 26 V.S.A.
9	chapter 38;
10	(L) an occupational therapist licensed pursuant to 26 V.S.A.
11	<u>chapter 71;</u>
12	(M) a speech-language pathologist licensed pursuant to 26 V.S.A.
13	chapter 87; and
14	(N) a dietician certified pursuant to 26 V.S.A. chapter 73.
15	(5) "Originating site" means the location of the patient, whether or
16	not accompanied by a health care provider, at the time services are
17	provided by a health care provider through telemedicine, including a
18	health care provider's office, a hospital, or a health care facility, or the
19	patient's home or another nonmedical environment such as a
20	school-based health center, a university-based health center, or the
21	patient's workplace.

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1	(6) "Store and forward" means an asynchronous transmission of medical
2	information to be reviewed at a later date by a health care provider at a distant
3	site who is trained in the relevant specialty and by which the health care
4	provider at the distant site reviews the medical information without the patient
5	present in real time.
6	(4)(7) "Telemedicine" means the delivery of health care services such as
7	diagnosis, consultation, or treatment through the use of live interactive audio
8	and video over a secure connection that complies with the requirements of the
9	Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, Public Law
10	104-191. Telemedicine does not include the use of audio-only telephone,
11	e-mail, or facsimile.
