# **Pharmacy Pilot**

- Meetings with Dr. Ramsey started in 2013
  - Pilot: check the impact of waiving prior authorizations
- Two drug classes: Statins (cholesterol) and Proton Pump Inhibitors (acid reflux)
  - Wanted to start with low cost categories
  - High use of generic drugs in these classes
  - Small number of prior authorizations
  - More likely prescribed by primary care physicians (PCPs)
- Focus on independent PCP practices
  - Used Blueprint practices (about 190 prescribers)



# **Pharmacy Pilot (cont)**

#### Participating Payers:

- VT Medicaid all members
- BCBSVT all exchange members
- MVP all members except ASO clients & Medicare Advantage

#### Pilot ran from May 2015 to May 2016

- Quarterly check-ins to review data
- All payers agreed to track the same data points



## Pharmacy Pilot Results - Medicaid

- VT Medicaid saw their costs for non-preferred proton pump inhibitors rise
  - Q1 3.2% increase
  - Q2 10.2% increase
  - Q3 22.5% increase
  - Q4 29.7% increase
- Conversely, the control group only had a 5.3% cost increase
  - Medicaid would have seen an increase in costs of \$250K-\$350K
    if the pilot had been continued and expanded

## Pharmacy Pilot Results - BCBSVT & MVP

#### BCBSVT had little change

 Heaviest prescribing PCP only requests 52 prior authorizations per year from BCBSVT (aka one per week) in all drug classes

#### MVP had little change

 Only about 10 prior authorization requests per year in VT in these drug classes

## Radiology Pilot

Different from the pharmacy pilot

- Prior authorizations were reviewed by local radiologists rather than the payers
- Involved requests for MRIs for lower back pain at Rutland and Porter hospitals

Same payers and populations as pharmacy pilot



# Radiology Pilot Results

- Low volume only 92 BCBSVT claims
- Similar results found between radiologists' review and payers' review

- Heavy administrative burden on the reviewers at the hospitals
  - The model was not found to be scalable
