Strategic Solutions Group (SSG) Report

Prepared for the Senate Health and Welfare Committee January 18, 2017

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BCBSVT Statutory Role

- JFO and SSG solicited BCBSVT input and perspective, as required by the statute.
- SSG held three sessions with key BCBSVT leaders:
 - BCBSVT participants had broad operational, systems and financial experience.
 - Most have been actively involved with VHC since the original implementation.
- Primary areas of SSG inquiry:
 - Current functioning of the system in particular enrollment, billing, data exchange; reconciliation.
 - How does VHC function in relation to our "other business"?
 - How are customers impacted by current state of VHC?

BCBSVT Perspective and Observations

The conclusions and recommendations within the Executive Summary are not fully supported by the actual content of the report.

- There are significant risks associated with SSG's recommendation that "the most feasible and cost-effective path for long-term sustainability is to continue to enhance the current VHC system".
- These risks are well-described within the body of the report, and should be given serious consideration.

Section 1: VHC Operational Readiness

We support SSG's conclusions within Section 1:

- "Although VHC is technically operating, it is doing so with significant deficiencies...Urgent work must be done to address these significant deficiencies."
- "The VHC system lacks automated functionality commonly used to ensure data integrity within systems...and represents a real and urgent threat to accurately servicing the constituents of Vermont."

Section 2 - Long-term Feasibility

We support SSG's conclusion in Section 2:

"While there has been marked progress, there remain significant deficiencies in needed functionality that make the current VHC system not sustainable or operationally cost effective."

Section 3 - Alternatives to VHC

- We believe that SSG presents a reasonable analysis of each of 7 alternatives.
- However, we have concerns that State will be able to overcome the risks associated with the recommended alternative. As SSG has observed:

"The next stage of the VHC/Integrated Eligibility (VHC/IE) program enhancements will be as challenging as the previous work over the last 3 years."

"The more extensive scope...and the compressed time frame for completion add new levels of complexity and risk."

"The program resources and inadequate governance model that was in place over the last 3 years will need to be addressed to meet the demanding requirements for the work to be performed".

"This endeavor has extremely high risk given that Vermont does not currently have all the necessary staff resources or expertise that can immediately be assigned on a full time basis to support a program of this size."

BCBSVT Perspective

- Action must be taken to resolve VHC issues affecting Vermonters within the commercial market.
 - We cannot allow uncertainties in Washington to divert us from initiating solutions to longstanding problems.
- We support an evaluation of the various component parts of VHC to identify those which can be successfully fixed, and those which should be replaced.
- The risks associated with SSG's recommendation should not be minimized, and alternative(s) with higher likelihood for success should be considered.
