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
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# Goals:

- ☑ Increasing patient access to the medical registry;
  - ✓ Referral to specialists
  - Expanded qualifying conditions
- ☑ Improving physical access to dispensaries;
  - ✓ More dispensaries in more places
- ☐ Reducing the cost burden on patients.
  - ✓ Grow and buy
  - More competition

But is that enough?

#### Prevailing Prices – 1oz. Dried Flower



### Additional Steps to Reduce Prices:

- 1. Allow patients to purchase from any dispensary, without designation.
  - \* Risk of illegal resale low given market prices
  - \* Fosters competition among dispensaries
- 2. Allow dispensary operators to grow without regard to number of registered patients.
  - Economies of scale
  - Comparative advantage
- 3. Allow patients to grow outdoors.

### Additional Steps to Reduce Prices, Thinking Outside the Box:

- 4. License independent cultivators to sell to dispensaries.
  - Increase supply to push prices down
- 5. Authorize caregivers to grow for multiple patients
  - Limits on remuneration?
- 6. Full legalization
  - In other states, dispensaries have become retailers
