<p>Sec. 2 House Corrective Action Plans under Act 250</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Not in Senate passed 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clarifies that actions taken under a corrective action plan or abatement do not require a permit or permit amendment under Act 250 (10 V.S.A. chapter 151).
<p>Sec. 3-4 Beverage Container Redemption</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Statute allows ANR to approve a retailer to not redeem beverage containers if a redemption center is established that serves the public need. • ANR rule provides it will approve a retailer to refuse to redeem beverage containers if a certified redemption center is located within a 5 mile radius of the retailer. • Sec. 4 repeals the ANR rule setting the 5 mile limit. • Sec. 3 requires ANR to consult with interested parties and report to the Legislature with recommended criteria for allowing a retailer to refuse beverage containers. • Statute would remain in place-i.e. ANR may approve a retailer to refuse if a redemption center meets public need.
