We are writing to encourage you to make investments in attracting new workers to Vermont. As you know, Vermont faces employee shortages in almost every sector. Our demographic challenges are at the heart of this shortage.

Investments in identifying and attracting new workers, reducing the barriers to relocation in the form of relocation assistance and incentives, and mechanisms to convert visitors to residents – such as the recently announced Stay to Stay weekends – are important to our businesses, and our regions. Today, it is essential that we spend more and more time and resources identifying and attracting employees.
