Thank you for providing the Vermont Association of Hospitals and Health Systems (VAHHS) with the opportunity to show its support for S. 164, Establishing the Unused Prescription Drug Repository Program.

VAHHS represents all of Vermont's not-for-profit hospitals. One our advocacy principles for 2018 is to ensure access to Vermont's top-rated health care system and services by making health care more affordable for Vermonters. High prescription drug prices create barriers to care for Vermonters every day. An unused prescription drug repository for dispensing low-cost prescription drugs to eligible Vermonters will provide greater access to much-needed treatments and help Vermonters avoid health crises due to inability to pay for prescription drugs.
