13	chapter 59 <u>28;</u>
14	(B) private investigators, security guards, and other persons licensed
15	under 26 V.S.A. chapter 59; and
16	(C) real estate appraisers and other persons or business entities
17	licensed under 26 V.S.A. chapter 69; and
18	(D) osteopathic physicians licensed under 26 V.S.A. chapter 33.

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1	Sec. 3. 26 V.S.A. § 1404 is added to read:
2	<u>§ 1404. APPLICANT FOR EXPEDITED LICENSURE; FINGERPRINT</u>
3	DATA
4	(a) An applicant for expedited licensure pursuant to section 1420e of this
5	chapter shall submit a full set of fingerprints to the Board for the purpose of
6	obtaining State and federal criminal background checks pursuant to
7	subdivision 1420e(b)(2) of this chapter. The Department of Public Safety may
8	exchange fingerprint data with the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
9	(b) Communications between the Board and the Interstate Medical
10	Licensure Compact Commission regarding verification of physician eligibility
11	for licensure under the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact shall not include
12	any information received from the Federal Bureau of Investigation related to
13	State and federal criminal background checks performed for the purposes of
14	subdivision 1420e(b)(2) of this chapter.
