2	The Committee on Health and Welfare to which was referred Senate Bill
3	No. 95 entitled "An act relating to sexual assault nurse examiners" respectfully
4	reports that it has considered the same and recommends that the bill be
5	amended by striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu
6	thereof the following:
7	Sec. 1. 13 V.S.A. chapter 167, subchapter 5 is amended to read:
8	Subchapter 5. Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners
9	§ 5431. DEFINITION; CERTIFICATION
10	(a) As used in this subchapter, "SANE" means a sexual assault nurse
11	examiner.
12	(b) A person licensed under 26 V.S.A. chapter 28 (nursing) may obtain a
13	specialized certification as a sexual assault nurse examiner if he or she
14	demonstrates compliance with the requirements for specialized certification as
15	established by the SANE Board.
16	§ 5432. SANE BOARD
17	(a) The SANE Board is created for the purpose of regulating sexual assault
18	nurse examiners advising the Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners Program.
19	(b) The SANE Board shall be composed of the following members:
20	(1) the Executive Director of the Vermont State Nurses Association or
21	designee;

1	(2) the President of the Vermont Association of Hospitals and Health
2	Systems;
3	(3) the Director of the Vermont Forensic Laboratory or designee;
4	(4) the Director of the Vermont Network Against Domestic and Sexual
5	Violence or designee;
6	(5) an attorney with experience prosecuting sexual assault crimes,
7	appointed by the Attorney General;
8	(6) the Executive Director of the Vermont Center for Crime Victim
9	Services or designee;
10	(7) a law enforcement officer assigned to one of Vermont's special units
11	of investigation, appointed by the Commissioner of Public Safety;
12	(8) a law enforcement officer employed by a municipal police
13	department, appointed by the Executive Director of the Vermont Criminal
14	Justice Training Council;
15	(9) three sexual assault nurse examiners, appointed by the Attorney
16	General;
17	(10) a physician health care provider as defined in 18 V.S.A. § 9402
18	whose practice includes the care of victims of sexual assault, appointed by the
19	Vermont Medical Society provider's supervising entity;

1	(11) a pediatrician whose practice includes the care of victims of sexual
2	assault, appointed by the Vermont Chapter of the American Academy of
3	Pediatrics;
4	(12) the Coordinator of the Vermont Victim Assistance Program or
5	designee;
6	(13) the President of the Vermont Alliance of Child Advocacy Centers
7	or designee;
8	(14) the Chair of the Vermont State Board of Nursing or designee; and
9	(15) the Commissioner for Children and Families or designee; and
10	(16) the Commissioner of Health or designee.
11	(c) The SANE Board shall advise the SANE Program on the following:
12	(1) statewide program priorities;
13	(2) training and educational requirements;
14	(3) a standardized sexual assault protocol and kit to be used by all
15	physicians and hospitals in this State when providing forensic examinations of
16	victims of alleged sexual offenses; and
17	(4) statewide policy development related to sexual assault nurse
18	examiner programs.
19	§ 5433. SANE PROGRAM CLINICAL COORDINATOR
20	A grant program shall be established by the A clinical coordinator position
21	shall be funded by either the Vermont Center for Crime Victim Services,

1	subject to available funding, to fund a clinical coordinator position for the or
2	through other identified state funding options purpose of staffing the SANE
3	program Program. The position shall be contracted through the Vermont
4	Network Against Domestic and Sexual Violence. The Clinical Coordinator
5	shall consult with the SANE Board in performing the following duties:
6	(1) overseeing the recruitment and retention of SANEs in the State of
7	Vermont;
8	(2) administering a statewide training educational program, including:
9	(A) the initial SANE certification training;
10	(B) ongoing training to ensure currency of practice for SANEs; and
11	(C) advanced training programs as needed;
12	(3) providing consultation and, technical assistance, and training to
13	SANEs and acute care hospitals regarding the standardized sexual assault
14	protocol standards of care for sexual assault patients; and
15	(4) providing training and outreach to criminal justice and community-
16	based agencies as needed; and
17	(5) coordinating and managing a system for ensuring best practices,
18	including as they apply to certification of sexual assault nurse examiners.
19	§ 5434. SANE BOARD DUTIES
20	(a) A person licensed under 26 V.S.A. chapter 28 (nursing) may obtain a
21	specialized certification as a sexual assault nurse examiner if he or she

1	demonstrates compliance with the requirements for specialized certification as
2	established by the SANE Board by rule.
3	(b) The SANE Board shall adopt the following by rule:
4	(1) educational requirements for obtaining specialized certification as a
5	sexual assault nurse examiner and statewide standards for the provision of
6	education;
7	(2) continuing education requirements and clinical experience necessary
8	for maintenance of the SANE specialized certification;
9	(3) a standardized sexual assault protocol and kit to be used by all
10	physicians and hospitals in this State when providing forensic examinations of
11	victims of alleged sexual offenses;
12	(4) a system of monitoring for compliance; and
13	(5) processes for investigating complaints, revoking certification, and
14	appealing decisions of the Board.
15	(c) The SANE Board may investigate complaints against a sexual assault
16	nurse examiner and may revoke certification as appropriate. [Repealed.]
17	§ 5435. ACCESS TO A SEXUAL ASSAULT NURSE EXAMINER
18	(a) On or before September 1, 2017, the Vermont Association of Hospitals
19	And Health Systems (VAHHS) and the Vermont SANE Program shall enter
20	into a memorandum of understanding (MOU) to ensure improved access to
21	Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners (SANE) for victims of sexual assault in

1	underserved regions. Improved access may include all acute care hospitals to
2	provide patients with care from a paid employee who is also a certified sexual
3	assault nurse examiner or access to a shared regional staffing pool that includes
4	certified sexual assault nurse examiners
5	(b) The Vermont SANE Program shall develop and offer a minimum
6	annual training regarding standards of care and forensic evidence collection to
7	emergency department appropriate health care providers at acute care hospitals
8	in Vermont. Personnel who are certified sexual assault nurse examiners shall
9	not be subject to this subsection.
10	(c) On or before January 1, 2018, The SANE Program shall report to the
11	Legislature on training participation rates pursuant to subsection (b).
12	_Sec. 3. SEXUAL ASSAULT EVIDENCE KITS; STUDY COMMITTEE
13	(a) Creation. There is created Sexual Assault Evidence Kit Study
14	Committee for the purpose of conducting a comprehensive examination of
15	issues related to sexual assault evidence kits.
16	(b) Membership. The Committee shall be composed of the following six
17	members:
18	(1) the Director of the Vermont Forensic Lab or designee;
19	(2) the Executive Director of the Vermont Center for Crime Victims
20	Services or designee;
21	(3) the Commissioner of Health or designee;

1	(4) a representative of Vermont Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners
2	(SANE) program;
3	(5) a representative of the county special investigative units appointed
4	by the Executive Director of the State's Attorney's and Sheriffs; and
5	(6) a law enforcement professional appointed by Commissioner of
6	Public Safety.
7	(c) Powers and duties. The Committee shall address the following issues:
8	(1) the current practices for kit tracking;
9	(2) the effectiveness and cost of a system allowing for the online
10	completion of sexual assault evidence kit documentation, with electronic
11	notification after reports are submitted;
12	(3) the feasibility and cost of a web-based tracking system to allow
13	agencies involved in the response and prosecution of sexual assault to track
14	sexual assault evidence kits, pediatric sexual assault evidence kits, and
15	toxicology kits using a bar code number uniquely assigned to each kit;
16	(4) the effectiveness and challenges of the current system of police
17	transport of evidence kits from hospitals to the Vermont Forensic
18	<u>Laboratory; and</u>
19	(5) the feasibility and cost of alternative methods of transport of sexual
20	assault evidence kits such as mail, delivery service, or courier.

1	(d) Assistance. The Committee shall have the administrative, technical,
2	and legal assistance of the Vermont Department of Health.
3	(e) Report. On or before November 1, 2017, the Committee shall submit a
4	written report to the House and Senate Committees on Judiciary, the House
5	Committee on Health Care, and the Senate Committee on Health and Welfare.
6	(f) Meetings.
7	(1) The Commissioner of Health shall call the first meeting of the
8	Committee to occur on or before August 1, 2017.
9	(2) The Committee shall select a chair from among its members at the
10	first meeting.
11	(3) A majority of the membership shall constitute a quorum.
12	(4) The Committee shall cease to exist on January 15, 2018.
13	(g) Reimbursement.
14	(1) For attendance at meetings during adjournment of the General
15	Assembly, legislative members of the Committee shall be entitled to per diem
16	compensation and reimbursement of expenses pursuant to 2 V.S.A. § 406 for
17	no more than five meetings.
18	(2) Other members of the Committee who are not employees of the
19	State of Vermont and who are not otherwise compensated or reimbursed for
20	their attendance shall be entitled to per diem compensation and reimbursement
21	of expenses pursuant to 32 V.S.A. § 1010 for no more than five meetings.
