ARCh (Accessing Resources for Children)

260 CLIENTS SUPPORTED IN FY16

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

ARCh (Accessing Resources for Children) is a collaboration between Developmental Services and Children's Mental Health to provide integrated support services to children up to the age of 22.

PERFORMANCE MEASURES

HOW MUCH

- **215 children** and their families received care coordination support (increase from 201 in FY15)
- 77 children received support from living skills staff
- **141 children** received Family Managed Respite – Fewer recipients, but higher utilization (46% in FY 15 to 70% in FY16)

HOW WELL

- 90% said they helped create their plan of care.
- 91% said I received the help I needed
- 94% said services were right for me
- 26 people who were waitlisted, were able to access ARCh services in FY16
- 27 people who were waitlisted were able to access Family Managed Respite

BETTER OFF

- 88% said their quality of life improved as a result of services.
- 80% of ARCh clients and families received support with transitions to adulthood.



100% said staff treated them with respect.

INNOVATIONS/CHANGES

- Increased staffing to 10 care coordinators and 6 living skills specialists
- Program staff attends multidisciplinary trainings to meet diverse needs of clients and families.
- ARCh utilized a master's level intern to provided additional support to families.

SERVICES PROVIDED

- Care coordination
- Family support services
 - Specialized behavior consultation
 - Living skills program
- Family managed respite

VERMONT AGENCY OF HUMAN SERVICES POPULATION OUTCOMES ADDRESSED

- Youth successfully transition to adulthood.
- Vermont's families are safe, nurturing, stable and supported



In FY15, additional funding allowed the program to reach more families. In FY16, the program reached capacity and families served in prior years continued to be supported through the ARCH program for ongoing treatment and support needs to maintain stabilization in their homes.
