925 beds by 2028

457 beds for male offenders (including out-of-state offenders)

175 beds for female offenders

120 beds for Federal offenders (revenue producing)

30 booking and receiving beds

50 ADA compliant beds for aging/infirm patients

50 forensic beds 20 high-acuity (DMH)

30 DOC forensic

18 infirmary beds, including 2 hospice and 3 quarantine beds

25 beds for youthful offenders (one option for Woodside population)

How Do We Get There?

- Complex can be built in stages, with one or two units coming online every two years until it is complete in 2028
- Savings achieved through closure of CRCF and NWCF and cost of deferred maintenance
- Increasing federal beds will generate additional revenue

- Begin construction on future facility, with Forensics wing as first "pod"
- Find location for Middlesex TCR
 permanent 16-bed facility
- Secure funding for Woodside
- Psychiatric beds at UVMMC
