
# **Population Accountability**

- OUTCOME: Desired condition of well-being for a whole population
- INDICATOR: Measure that helps quantify the achievement of an outcome

# **Performance Accountability**

- PROGRAM PERFORMANCE MEASURE: Measure of how well a program, agency, or service system is working.
  - How much?
  - How well?
  - Is anyone better off? = PROGRAM or CUSTOMER RESULT

# Population Well-being vs. Client Well-being

# Population Accountability = Well-being of a whole population or conditions in a geographic area.

- Bigger than any one program, or agency
- Bigger than Government
- Requires the whole community, public and private partners to make a difference.

# Performance Accountability = Accountability for the performance of a program, agency, or service system.

- Are clients better off?
- What is the effect of the program?

# Outcomes vs. Indicators

# Outcomes =

Desired condition of wellbeing for a whole population

# **Indicators** =

Measure that helps quantify the achievement of an outcome

- What are the most important desired conditions?
- Simple, lofty phrases not easily politicized
- Don't reference services or organizations
- Not about data (leave that to indicators)

- To what extent are we achieving desired conditions?
- About conditions or people's lives, whether or not they receive any service
- Neutral gauge for how things are going
- Proxy for well-being matter of approximation

# Indicators vs. Performance Measures

# **Indicators** =

About whole populations or statewide conditions.

Performance Measures = About client populations or activities.

- About conditions or people's lives, whether or not they receive any service
- Neutral gauge for how things are going
- Proxy for well-being matter of approximation

- Usually about people receiving a service.
- Is the program making a difference for them?
- About the result of specific activities that someone or entity is responsible for doing



# **Population Accountability**

- Statewide, population-level <u>outcomes</u> and <u>indicators</u>
- Executive Branch reports indicators annually



# **Performance Accountability (for the Executive Branch)**

- Executive Branch contributes through <u>results of programs</u> over time
- Executive Branch reports <u>performance measures</u> for a number of programs annually (Program Performance Measure Budget)
