This act summary is provided for the convenience of the public and members of the General Assembly. It is intended to provide a general summary of the act and may not be exhaustive. It has been prepared by the staff of the Office of Legislative Council without input from members of the General Assembly. It is not intended to aid in the interpretation of legislation or to serve as a source of legislative intent.

Act No. 125 (S.301). Public service; telecommunications; siting; E-911 An act relating to miscellaneous telecommunications changes

This act:

- extends date after which no new 30 V.S.A. § 248a applications may be submitted from July 1, 2020 to July 1, 2023;
- allows the Public Utility Commission (PUC) to grant waivers to allow construction of temporary telecommunications facilities during a declared state of emergency;
- requires the PUC report back to the Legislature any recommendations to update 248a criteria;
- allows towns to request an additional 30-day notice period for certificate of public good applications for telecommunications facilities during the COVID-19 state of emergency;
- clarifies that the E-911 Board's outage reporting rule applies to outages caused by a provider's network failure, not the failure of a subscriber's backup power equipment; and
- specifies that the E-911 Board shall initiate the rulemaking process for outage reporting rules when one or more states with a combined population of 20 million adopts an outage reporting rule with a wireless reporting threshold that is lower than the FCC's NORS threshold applicable to wireless providers. The Board's rule shall incorporate the lower threshold for wireless providers.
