Whereas, a core value that the Central Vermont Council on Aging upholds is the respect and empowerment of older Vermonters, and

Whereas, the many services that the Central Vermont Council on Aging offers include case management, a help line, access to benefits, long-term care planning, transportation support, and Meals on Wheels, and

Whereas, the Central Vermont Council on Aging is a 2020 recipient of the Governor's Excellence in Worksite Wellness–GOLD Level Award, now therefore be it
