

No. R-391. House concurrent resolution in memory of Putnam Wentworth Blodgett.

(H.C.R.322)

Whereas, Dartmouth College Alumni Award winner Putnam (Put) Blodgett maintained a long-term association with both his alma mater's athletics program and Moosilauke Ravine Lodge, and

Whereas, Put Blodgett was a dairy farmer who raised Holsteins and a tree farmer, and he established the boys' Challenge Wilderness Camp, and

Whereas, he held leadership roles in State, regional, and national camping associations, was twice honored as the Vermont Outstanding Tree Farmer of the Year, was named Northeastern Tree Farmer of the Year, served as president of the Vermont Woodlands Association, and was inducted into the Vermont Agricultural Hall of Fame, and

Whereas, Put Blodgett died on March 3, 2020 at 88 years of age, and his survivors include his wife, Marion, and his children, now therefore be it
