16	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
17	Sec. 1. FINDINGS
18	The General Assembly finds that the management and operation of a
19	correctional facility involves functions that are inherently governmental.

1	It further finds that issues of liability and accountability warrant a prohibition
2	on State contracts with for-profit correctional facilities.
3	Sec. 2. 28 V.S.A. § 123 is added to read:
4	§ 123. CONTRACTS; PROHIBITION
5	(a) The State shall not contract with a for-profit contractor to provide
6	services relating to the ownership, operation, or management of a State
7	correctional facility, except for the following:
8	(1) State work release centers or juvenile residential facilities that
9	provide separate care or special treatment centers operated in whole or part by
10	private contractors; or
11	(2) contracts for ancillary services, including medical services,
12	educational services, repair and maintenance contracts, or other services not
13	directly related to the ownership, management, or operation of security
14	services in a State correctional facility.
15	(b) The State shall not contract with a for-profit contractor to provide
16	supervision, housing, treatment, or care to inmates under the custody of the
17	Commissioner in an out-of-state correctional facility.
18	Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATES
19	(a) Secs. 1 and Sec. 2(a) of this act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.
20	(b) Sec. 2(b) of this act shall take effect on October 1, 2020.
