7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to direct a
8	working group of interested stakeholders to design a program of income-
9	sensitized health insurance premiums for individuals and families.
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10	An act relating to income-sensitized health insurance premiums
11	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
12	Sec. 1. INCOME-SENSITIZED HEALTH INSURANCE PREMIUMS;
13	WORKING GROUP; REPORT
14	(a) Creation. There is created a working group to design a program of
15	income-sensitized health insurance premiums for individuals and families in
16	Vermont.
17	(b) Membership. The working group shall be composed of the following
18	members:
19	(1) the Commissioner of Vermont Health Access or designee, who
20	shall be the Chair;

1	(2) the Commissioner of Taxes or designee;
2	(3) the Chief Health Care Advocate or designee from the Office of the
3	Health Care Advocate;
4	(4) a representative of Vermonters with low income, selected by the
5	Vermont Low-Income Advocacy Council;
6	(5) a representative of Vermont employers that offer health insurance
7	to their employees, selected by Vermont Businesses for Social
8	Responsibility; and
9	(6) other interested stakeholders.
10	(c) Powers and duties. The working group shall consider mechanisms for
11	making health insurance affordable for all Vermont residents and shall design
12	a program for using income-sensitized premiums. The working group's
13	considerations shall include the following:
14	(1) the maximum percentage of an individual's or family's income that
15	the individual or family should be required to pay for health insurance
16	premiums;
17	(2) the impact of cost-sharing requirements, including deductibles, co-
18	payments, and coinsurance, on the total cost of care that is borne by
19	individuals with a chronic illness or condition;

1	(3) ways to encourage and incentivize the use of preventive care to
2	avoid the need for costlier services that may be necessary if preventable
3	illnesses and conditions are left untreated;
4	(4) how to link the cost of health insurance to an individual's or
5	family's income;
6	(5) ways to generate the revenue needed to subsidize premiums for
7	Vermont residents to ensure that no individual or family pays more than the
8	maximum percentage identified in subdivision (1) of this subsection;
9	(6) whether there should be any restrictions on the types of health
10	insurance plans that an individual or family may purchase using an income-
11	sensitized premium; and
12	(7) whether the amount of the subsidy should be based on the premium
13	amount for a specified plan.
14	(d) Assistance. The working group shall have the administrative,
15	technical, and legal assistance of the Department of Vermont Health Access.
16	(e)(1) Report. On or before January 15, 2020, the working group shall
17	provide its program design for income-sensitized premiums to the House
18	Committees on Health Care, on Appropriations, and on Ways and Means and
19	the Senate Committees on Health and Welfare, on Appropriations, and on
20	Finance, as well as its findings and recommendations regarding the
21	considerations set forth in subdivisions (c)(1)–(7) of this section.
