14	and other states. The Commission	ner may recall any permit or license issued to
15	a minor whenever he or she is sati	sfied, from information provided by a
16	credible person and upon investiga	ation, that the operator is mentally or
17	physically unfit or, because of his	or her habits or record as to accidents or
18	convictions, is unsafe to be trusted	l with the operation of motor vehicles. On

be reinstated upon expiration of a specific term, and, if required by the
Commissioner, when the person has passed a reexamination approved by the
Commissioner.
