15	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

19	(a) Restaurants and similar food service establishments as defined in
20	section 4301 of this title that are part of a chain with 20 or more locations
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1	doing business under the same name and offering for sale substantially the
2	same menu items shall disclose on the menu and on the menu board:
3	(1) adjacent to the name of each standard menu item the number of
4	calories contained in the item; and
5	(2) a succinct statement concerning suggested daily caloric intake.

9	(a) Restaurants and other food service establishments as defined in
10	section 4301 of this title shall disclose on the menu and on the menu board,
11	adjacent to the name of each menu item, the presence of an allergen identified
12	on a list maintained by the Commissioner of Health by rule.
13	(b) The Commissioner shall adopt a rule pursuant to 3 V.S.A. chapter 25
14	that identifies those allergens that shall be listed on menus and menu boards of
15	restaurants and other food service establishments in accordance with
16	subsection (a) of this section. At least the following allergens shall be listed:
17	(1) gluten;
18	(2) wheat;
