7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require energy
8	efficiency charges against fuel ratepayers, Low Income Assistance Program
9	fees assessed against natural gas ratepayers, and electric discount program fees
10	to be voluntary. This bill also requires that notice be provided to ratepayers of
11	how to withdraw from the proposed voluntary charges.

14	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
15	Sec. 1. 30 V.S.A. § 209 is amended to read:
16	§ 209. JURISDICTION; GENERAL SCOPE

18	(3) Energy efficiency charge; regulated fuels. In addition to its existing
19	authority, the Commission may establish by order or rule a voluntary,
20	volumetric charge to customers for the support of energy efficiency programs

1	that meet the requirements of section 218c of this title, with due consideration
2	to the State's energy policy under section 202a of this title and to its energy
3	and economic policy interests under section 218e of this title to maintain and
4	enhance the State's economic vitality. The charge shall be known as the
5	energy efficiency charge, shall be shown separately on each customer's bill,
6	and shall be paid to a fund administrator appointed by the Commission and
7	deposited into the Electric Efficiency Fund. When such a charge is shown,
8	notice as to how to obtain information about energy efficiency programs
9	approved under this section and how a customer may withdraw from the
10	voluntary charge shall be provided in a clear and discernible manner directed
11	by the Commission. This notice shall include, at a minimum, a toll-free
12	telephone number, and, to the extent feasible, shall be on the customer's bill
13	and near the energy efficiency charge.

18	(g)(1) The Public Utility Commission shall require natural gas suppliers
19	subject to regulation under 30 V.S.A. § 203 to provide a discount program to
20	customers with incomes no greater than 200 percent of the federal poverty
21	level or who meet the Department for Children and Families' means test of

1	eligibility for LIHEAP crisis fuel assistance. Eligibility for the discount shall
2	be verified by the Department for Children and Families.

4	(4) Any assistance program fee assessed to ineligible ratepayers to offset
5	the cost of the discount program under this section shall be voluntary and at the
6	discretion of the ratepayer. When such a charge is shown on a ratepayer's bill,
7	notice as to how to obtain information about the Low Income Assistance
8	Program approved under this section and how a customer may withdraw from
9	the voluntary charge shall be provided in a clear and discernible manner. This
10	notice shall include, at a minimum, a toll-free telephone number and, to the
11	extent feasible, shall be on the customer's bill and near the assistance program
12	fee charge.

17	(e) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this section, the Commission,
18	on its own motion or upon petition of any person, may issue an order
19	approving a rate schedule, tariff, agreement, contract, or settlement that
20	provides reduced rates for low-income electric utility consumers better to
21	assure affordability. For the purposes of this subsection, "low-income electric

1	utility consumer" means a customer who has a household income at or below
2	150 percent of the current federal poverty level. When considering whether to
3	approve a rate schedule, tariff, agreement, contract, or settlement for low-
4	income electric utility consumers, the Commission shall take into account the
5	potential impact on, and cost-shifting to, other utility customers. Any cost-
6	shifting to ineligible utility customers to offset the cost of a discount program
7	under this section shall be a voluntary fee and at the discretion of the utility
8	customer. When an offset fee is shown on a customer's bill, notice as to how
9	to obtain information about the discount program approved under this section
10	and how a customer may withdraw from the voluntary fee shall be provided in
11	a clear and discernible manner. This notice shall include, at a minimum, a toll-
12	free telephone number and, to the extent feasible, shall be on the customer's
13	bill and near the offset fee charge.
