9	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to establish a
10	working group in the Agency of Human Services that would explore
11	opportunities to integrate the inmate population into new and existing health
12	care payment and delivery system reform initiatives in order to promote inmate
13	health and constrain State spending by managing chronic conditions, focusing
14	on wellness and preventive care, and making appropriate use of existing
15	programs and resources.
16 17	An act relating to integration of Vermont's inmate population into the State's health care reform initiatives
18	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
19	Sec. 1. FINDINGS
20	The General Assembly finds that:

1	(1) The Department of Corrections spent \$21 million on inmate health
2	care during fiscal year 2018, of which \$20.2 million was the cost of the State's
3	contract with a vendor to administer and deliver health care services in
4	Vermont's correctional facilities.
5	(2) According to a recent study of health care system costs in Vermont's
6	Department of Corrections, the small size of Vermont's facilities and
7	comparatively low average daily inmate populations inhibit the delivery of
8	cost-effective health care in a correctional facility setting.
9	(3) High-quality health care services are currently being delivered by
10	health care providers throughout the State in a variety of inpatient, outpatient,
11	and community settings.
12	(4) Vermont has a history of implementing innovative health care
13	reform initiatives designed to improve health outcomes and bend the cost
14	curve, including the Blueprint for Health, accountable care organizations, and
15	the All-Payer Model.
16	(5) The Agency of Human Services and other stakeholders should
17	explore opportunities to integrate the inmate population into new and existing
18	health care payment and delivery system reform initiatives in order to promote
19	inmate health and constrain State spending by managing chronic conditions,
20	focusing on wellness and preventive care, and making efficient and appropriate
21	use of existing programs and resources.

1	Sec. 2. INTEGRATING VERMONT INMATES INTO HEALTH CARE
2	REFORM INITIATIVES; REPORT
3	(a) Creation. The Secretary of Human Services shall convene a working
4	group to explore opportunities to integrate Vermont's inmate population into
5	new and existing health care payment and delivery system reform initiatives.
6	(b) Membership. The working group shall be composed of the following
7	members:
8	(1) the Secretary of Human Services or designee, who shall be the
9	<u>Chair;</u>
10	(2) the Commissioner of Corrections or designee;
11	(3) the Commissioner of Vermont Health Access or designee;
12	(4) the Chair of the Green Mountain Care Board or designee;
13	(5) the Executive Director of the Blueprint for Health or designee;
14	(6) the Chief Health Care Advocate from the Office of the Health Care
15	Advocate or designee; and
16	(7) other interested stakeholders.
17	(c) Powers and duties. The working group shall explore opportunities to
18	integrate the inmate population into new and existing health care payment
19	and delivery system reform initiatives in order to promote inmate health and
20	constrain State spending by managing chronic conditions, focusing on

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1	wellness and preventive care, and making efficient and appropriate use of
2	existing programs and resources
3	(d) Assistance. The working group shall have the administrative,
4	technical, and legal assistance of the Agency of Human Services.
5	(e) Report. On or before December 1, 2019, the working group shall
6	submit a written report to the House Committees on Corrections and
7	Institutions and on Health Care, the Senate Committees on Institutions, on
8	Judiciary, and on Health and Welfare, and the Joint Legislative Justice
9	Oversight Committee with its findings and any recommendations for
10	legislative action.
11	(f) Meetings.
12	(1) The Secretary of Human Services or designee shall call the first
13	meeting of the working group to occur on or before July 1, 2019.
14	(2) The working group shall cease to exist upon submission of its
15	report pursuant to subsection (e) of this section.
