13	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to prohibit the
14	transfer of Vermont inmates to an out-of-state correctional facility.
15 16	An act relating to prohibition on the transfer of Vermont inmates to an out- of-state correctional facility
17	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
18	Sec. 1. FINDINGS
19	The General Assembly finds that:

1	(1) Housing inmates in an out-of-state correctional facility is not a
2	temporary solution and results in a long-term costly and unsustainable practice
3	for the State.
4	(2) Sending inmates out of state discourages visits from family and
5	friends. Studies have shown a correlation between visitation and reduced
6	recidivism upon completion of prison time.
7	(3) Out-of-state inmates have restricted access to legal counsel, resulting
8	in an increased reliance on telecommunication. This additional burden
9	subjects prisoners and those who wish to contact them to exorbitant prison
10	phone rates.
11	(4) The State is unable to provide the same level of oversight and care
12	for prisoners held at out-of-state correctional facilities.

14	§ 102. COMMISSIONER OF CORRECTIONS; APPOINTMENT;
15	POWERS; RESPONSIBILITIES
16	(a) The Department is under the direction of the Commissioner, who shall
17	be appointed by the Secretary of Human Services with the approval of the
18	Governor and shall serve at the pleasure of the Secretary. The Commissioner's
19	salary shall be fixed by the Governor within the appropriation for that purpose.

12	Sec. 3. 28 V.S.A. § 817 is amended to read:
13	§ 817. CREATION OF WORK CAMPS; INTENT
14	It is the intent of the general assembly General Assembly that the creation
15	of one or more new work camps in fiscal year 2006 and after will help alleviate
16	overcrowded conditions in the state's State's correctional facilities and permit
17	Vermonters housed in out-of-state facilities to be brought home to Vermont.
18	The general assembly General Assembly specifically does not intend the
19	creation of new work camps to result in an increase in the total number of
20	Vermont offenders sentenced to incarceration. Therefore, specific plans and
21	programs developed by the department of corrections <u>Department of</u>

1	Corrections shall restrict placement in new work camps to those offenders who
2	have been convicted of a nonviolent offense and who have served a portion of
3	their current sentence within a correctional facility. No court shall impose a
4	sentence of imprisonment to be served initially or solely within the new
5	facility.
6	Sec. 4. OUT-OF-STATE FACILITIES; PROHIBITION
7	No inmate under the custody of the Commissioner shall be supervised,
8	housed, treated, or cared for in an out-of-state correctional facility.
9	Sec. 5. EFFECTIVE DATE
10	This act shall take effect on October 1, 2020.
