8	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to adopt various
9	proposals to promote economic development in smaller Vermont communities.
10 11	An act relating to promoting economic development in smaller Vermont communities
12	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
13	* * * Local Option Tax * * *
14	Sec. 1. 24 V.S.A. § 138(d) is amended to read:
15	(d)(1) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section and, in
16	subdivision (2) of this subsection with respect to taxes collected on the sale of
17	aviation jet fuel, and in subdivision (3) of this subsection governing small rural
18	communities, of the taxes collected under this section, 70 percent of the taxes
19	shall be paid on a quarterly basis to the municipality in which they were
20	collected, after reduction for the costs of administration and collection under

1	subsection (c) of this section. Revenues received by a municipality may be
2	expended for municipal services only, and not for education expenditures.
3	Any remaining revenue shall be deposited into the PILOT Special Fund
4	established by 32 V.S.A. § 3709.
5	(2)(A) Of the taxes collected under this section on the sale of aviation jet
6	fuel, on a quarterly basis, 70 percent of the taxes shall be paid to the
7	municipality in which they were collected, and 30 percent shall be deposited in
8	the Transportation Fund.
9	(B) All revenues referenced in subdivision (A) of this subdivision (2)
10	shall be used exclusively for aviation purposes consistent with 49 U.S.C.
11	§ 47133 and Federal Aviation Administration regulations and policies.
12	(3) For a municipality with fewer than 3,000 residents that adopts a tax
13	pursuant to this section on or after July 1, 2019, 90 percent of the taxes shall be
14	paid to the municipality and 10 percent shall be paid to the PILOT Special
15	Fund.

18	On or before January 15, 2020, the Agency of Commerce and Community
19	Development shall evaluate and submit to the House Committee on Commerce

21	Development, Housing and General Affairs one or more recommendations for

1	how the State can supplement or expand the federal Opportunity Zones
2	program to serve communities with fewer than 4,000 residents.

6	(a) The Agency of Commerce and Community Development shall provide
7	rural marketing support to smaller Vermont communities and assistance with
8	designing and implementing small-town destination marketing campaigns,
9	including public-private partnerships with businesses and ski areas in
10	communities with fewer than 3,000 residents.
11	(b) On or before January 15, 2020, the Agency shall report to the House
12	Committee on Commerce and Economic Development and to the Senate
13	Committee on Economic Development, Housing and General Affairs
14	identifying the municipalities and the type of support provided to each
15	municipality served.

19	(a) The Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation shall provide
20	rural outdoor recreation support and assistance with promoting outdoor

10	§ 446. VERMONT RECREATIONAL TRAILS FUND
11	(a) The Recreational Trails Fund is established, which shall be subject to
12	the provisions of 32 V.S.A. chapter 7, subchapter 5.
13	(b)(1) There shall be an annual transfer from the Transportation Fund to the
14	Recreational Trails Fund in the amount of \$370,000.00 \$500,000.00.
15	(2) In each fiscal year, this amount shall be included in the budget
16	estimates and statements submitted under 32 V.S.A. § 301 for purposes of
17	determining appropriations by the General Assembly. Appropriations may be
18	made from the Fund to design, construct, and maintain recreational trails, to
19	conduct studies and prepare plans, to publish maps and information, and to
20	make grants to State and municipal agencies and nonprofit organizations.

(c) The Agency of Natural Resources shall administer the Fund and adopt
rules for its use and all monies appropriated shall be used on State, federal, and
municipal lands and on maintenance of trails on public as well as private lands
where permission is granted, as follows:
(1) 40 30 percent to the Department of Forests, Parks and Recreation;
(2) 20 40 percent for providing grants to municipalities and nonprofit
agencies, not less than 10 percent of which shall be used to assist communities
with fewer than 3,000 residents to develop and maintain trail networks; and
(3) 40 30 percent to the Vermont Association of Snow Travelers.
