6	Subject: Conservation and development; transportation; road and bridge
7	standards; town highway aid; municipal highway access
8	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require the
9	Agency of Transportation to revise the town road and bridge standards to
10	include best management practices for management of access by private
11	driveways and private roads to town highways. Municipalities that adopt the
12	best management practices for management of access by private driveways and
13	private roads to town highways would receive a higher State share of town
14	highway and bridge funding.

1	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
2	Sec. 1. FINDINGS
3	The General Assembly finds that:
4	(1) Under 19 V.S.A. § 1111, a person is required to obtain a permit from
5	a municipality to "develop, construct, regrade, or resurface any driveway,
6	entrance, or approach, or build a fence or building, or deposit material of any
7	kind within, or to in any way affect the grade of a highway right-of-way, or
8	obstruct a ditch, culvert, or drainage course that drains a highway, or fill or
9	grade the land adjacent to a highway so as to divert the flow of water onto the
10	highway right-of-way".
11	(2) The Vermont League of Cities and Towns (VLCT) has issued a
12	model town highway access policy to assist municipalities in complying with
13	the requirements of 19 V.S.A. § 1111.
14	(3) Many towns have adopted the VLCT model town highway access
15	policy, but many towns have not, and some towns are not enforcing the
16	requirements for a permit for activities in the town highway right-of-way.
17	(4) Failure to properly permit or regulate activities within the town
18	highway right-of-way can have significant effects, including increased threats
19	to highway infrastructure, increased stormwater runoff, destruction of
20	wetlands, and increased threats of flooding.

1	(5) To provide guidance on the proper management of activities within
2	the town highway right-of-way, the State should require the Agency of
3	Transportation (AOT), after consultation with the Agency of Natural
4	Resources, to amend the town road and bridge standards to include minimum
5	requirements for access to town highways.
6	(6) To incentivize municipal adoption of the AOT standards for access
7	to town highways, the State should require those municipalities that fail to
8	adopt the AOT standards for access to town highways to provide an increased
9	amount of funding as match in order to receive town highway aid.

11	§ 996. HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE, AND REPAIR
12	BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES
13	(a) The agency of transportation Agency of Transportation shall work with
14	municipal representatives to revise the agency of transportation's Agency of
15	Transportation's town road and bridge standards in order to incorporate a suite
16	of practical and cost-effective best management practices, as approved by the
17	agency of natural resources Agency of Natural Resources, for the construction,
18	maintenance, and repair of all existing and future state State and town
19	highways and for management of access by private driveways and private
20	roads to town highways. These best management practices shall address
21	activities which that have a potential for causing pollutants to enter the

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1	groundwater and waters of the state State, including stormwater runoff and
2	direct discharges to state State waters. The best management practices shall
3	not supersede any requirements for stormwater management already set forth
4	in 10 V.S.A. §§ § 1264 and 1264a that apply to state State and town highways.
5	The agency of transportation shall report to the house and senate committees
6	on transportation, the house committee on fish, wildlife and water resources,
7	and the senate committee on natural resources and energy by January 15, 2011,
8	on the best management practices to be incorporated into the agency of
9	transportation's town road and bridge standards.
10	(b) Beginning on January 15, 2013 2020, and every four years thereafter,
11	the secretary Secretary, in consultation with municipal representatives and with
12	approval from the agency of natural resources Agency of Natural Resources,
13	shall review and revise, as appropriate, town road and bridge standards in order
14	to ensure the standards are protective of water quality.

(b) Notwithstanding subsection 309a(a) of this title, grants provided to towns under the Class 2 Town Highway Roadway Program shall be matched by local funds sufficient to cover 30 percent of the project costs, unless the town: has adopted road and bridge standards, including best management practices for management of access by private roads and private driveways to town highways; has completed a network inventory; and has submitted an annual certification of compliance for town road and bridge standards to the secretary Secretary, in which event the local match shall be sufficient to cover 20 percent of the project costs. The secretary Secretary may adopt rules to implement the Class 2 Town Highway Roadway Program. Class 2 town highway roadway projects receiving funds pursuant to this subsection shall be the responsibility of the applicant municipality, and a municipality shall not receive a grant in excess of \$175,000.00.

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1	Sec. 4. REPORT; BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES FOR
2	MANAGEMENT OF ACCESS TO TOWN HIGHWAYS
3	On or before January 15, 2020, the Secretary of Transportation, after
4	consultation with the Secretary of Natural Resources, shall report to the House
5	Committees on Transportation and on Natural Resources, Fish, and Wildlife
6	and the Senate Committees on Transportation and on Natural Resources and
7	Energy regarding implementation of the requirement of 19 V.S.A. § 996 to
8	incorporate into the Agency of Transportation's town road and bridge
9	standards best management practices for management of access to town
10	highways by private roads and private driveways. The report shall include the
11	proposed or adopted best management practices for access to town highways
12	by private roads and private driveways and a general timeline for adoption or
13	implementation by municipalities.
