1	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
2	Sec. 1. FINDINGS AND INTENT
3	(a) The General Assembly finds that:
4	(1) The building located at 133 State Street in Montpelier was purchased
5	by the State of Vermont in 1960 to be used for offices for a growing State
6	government.
7	(2) Philip Henderson Hoff was elected Governor of the State of
8	Vermont in 1962.
9	(3) Governor Hoff served as Governor for three terms during a period of
10	many changes in Vermont and the nation.
11	(4) Governor Hoff believed in a strong role for State government and
12	oversaw the expansion of State government services for the people of
13	Vermont.
14	(5) The first master plan for the Capital Complex, which included using
15	the building located at 133 State Street, was created in 1966 during Governor
16	Hoff's second term.
17	(6) Governor Hoff passed away on April 26, 2018.
18	(7) The building located at 133 State Street continues to house State
19	offices in the Capital Complex.

1	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly to honor the late Governor Hoff
2	by naming the State office building located at 133 State Street in Montpelier
3	after him.

6	(1) "Asa Bloomer State Office Building" shall be the name of the
7	building now known as the "Hulett" office building in the city of Rutland.

10	State office building at 133 State Street in Montpelier.
11	Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE
12	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.
