8	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to provide law
9	enforcement authority to Agency of Natural Resources environmental
10	enforcement officers who are certified by the Vermont Criminal Justice
11	Training Council as Level II or Level III law enforcement officers.
12 13	An act relating to providing law enforcement authority to environmental enforcement officers
14	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
15	Sec. 1. 10 V.S.A. § 906 is amended to read:
16	§ 906. INVESTIGATORS ENVIRONMENTAL ENFORCEMENT
17	<u>OFFICERS</u>
18	(a) Investigators Environmental enforcement officers employed by the
19	department of environmental conservation when designated in writing by the
20	commissioner of environmental conservation Agency of Natural Resources

shall enforce the <u>applicable</u> provisions of chapters 37, 39, 41, 43, 47 and 49
and subchapter 3 of chapter 48 of this title; Title 29, chapter 11; sections 1215
and 1217 of Title 18; section 2201 of Title 24 and sections 4411 and 4444 of
Title 24 insofar as those chapters and sections contain enforceable provisions
and may summons or arrest violators thereof set forth in section 8003 of this
title. In those matters, they may serve criminal process and subpoenas, and
they may serve civil process and administrative process as provided in chapter
201 of this title, including subpoenas, summonses, and access orders. They
shall have the same powers as other informing officers to make and subscribe
to complaints for violation thereof.
(b)(1) Upon certification as a Level II or Level III law enforcement officer
by the Vermont Criminal Justice Training Council pursuant to 20 V.S.A.
chapter 151, an environmental enforcement officer shall have the same powers
as sheriffs in criminal matters and the enforcement of the law and shall have al
the immunities and defenses available to sheriffs in a suit brought against them
in consequence of acts done in the course of employment.
(2) An environmental enforcement officer shall receive his or her
regular compensation during the time he or she is enrolled in a certification
training program.

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1	(c) The Secretary of Natural Resources shall develop and implement
2	policies and standard operating procedures governing the manner in which
3	environmental enforcement officers may exercise law enforcement authority.
4	These policies and procedures shall include provisions regarding the carrying
5	and use of firearms, sirens, and colored lamps and shall be in accordance with
6	the training and certification requirements for law enforcement officers set
7	forth in 20 V.S.A. chapter 151.

5	§ 3002. IMPERSONATION OF OFFICER
6	A person who impersonates or attempts to impersonate a sheriff, deputy
7	sheriff, constable, police officer, fish and game warden, environmental
8	enforcement officer, or any other State, county, or town officer shall:
9	(1) for the first offense, be imprisoned not more than six months or fined
10	not more than \$500.00, or both;
11	(2) for the second offense and subsequent offenses, be imprisoned not
12	more than two years or fined not more than \$1,000.00, or both.
