13	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
14	Sec. 1. NEW UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT; ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT;
15	AMENDMENT; INDEBTEDNESS; TAX RATES
16	(a) Definitions. As used in this act:
17	(1) "Merging district" means a school district that is ordered by the State
18	Board Order to merge into a newly formed district.
19	(2) "Newly formed district" means a school district that is formed by the
20	State Board Order.

1	(3) "State Board Order" means the section of the State Board Report
2	entitled "State Board of Education's 'order merging and realigning districts
3	and supervisory unions where necessary pursuant to Act 46, Sec. 10(b)."
4	(4) "State Board Report" means the "Final Report of the Decisions and
5	Order on Statewide School District Merger Decisions Pursuant to Act 46,
6	Sections 8(b) and 10" issued by the State Board of Education dated
7	<u>November 28, 2018.</u>
8	(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a newly formed district
9	may amend its articles of agreement to equalize homestead property tax rates
10	and household income percentages for each town associated with a district that
11	merged into a newly formed district to reflect the level of capital debt
12	contributed to the newly formed district by that merging district pursuant to the
13	process set forth in 16 V.S.A. chapter 11.
14	Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE
15	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
