6	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to permit
7	second-class licensees to purchase wine and beer on terms that require
8	payment within not more than 30 days, to permit second-class licensees to sell
9	wine and beer on consignment, to amend the amount of wine and beer that a
10	retail delivery permit holder can deliver to a Vermont resident, to make various
11	amendments to the provisions governing retail alcoholic beverage tastings, and
12	to permit wineries to obtain a second-class license and a wholesale dealer's or
13	packager's license.

15	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

1	(b)(1) A second-class license permits the holder to export malt and vinous
2	beverages and to sell malt and vinous beverages to the public from the licensed
3	premises for consumption off the premises.
4	(2) The Division of Liquor Control may grant a second-class licensee a
5	fortified wine permit pursuant to section 225 of this chapter or a retail delivery
6	permit pursuant to section 226 of this chapter.
7	(3)(A) Except as otherwise provided pursuant to sections 225, 271, and
8	278 of this title and subsection (d) of this section, a second-class license holder
9	shall purchase all malt beverages and vinous beverages sold pursuant to its
10	license from Vermont wholesale dealers or packagers.
11	(B) A second-class licensee may purchase malt beverages and vinous

13	(i) for cash paid at the time of delivery; or
14	(ii) on terms that require the licensee to pay the full amount due

5	(a)(1) The Division of Liquor Control may grant a licensee a permit to
6	conduct an alcoholic beverage tasting event as provided in subsection (b) of
7	this section if:
8	(1)(A) the licensee has submitted a written application in a form
9	required by the Commissioner and paid the fee provided in section 204 of this
10	title at least five days prior to the date of the alcoholic beverage tasting event;
11	and
12	(2)(B) the Commissioner determines that the licensee is in good
13	standing.
14	(2) The application for a daily permit and the associated fee provided in
15	section 204 of this title shall be paid at least five days prior to the date of the
16	alcoholic beverage tasting event.
17	(b) The Division may grant the following alcoholic beverage tasting
18	permits to the following types of licensees:
19	(1) A second-class licensee <u>may be granted a daily or an annual tasting</u>
20	<u>permit</u> .

1	(A) The A daily permit and an annual permit authorizes shall
2	authorize the employees of the second-class licensee or of a designated
3	manufacturer or rectifier to dispense to each customer of legal age on the
4	licensee's premises malt or vinous beverages by the glass not to exceed two
5	ounces of each beverage with a total of eight ounces of malt or vinous
6	beverages.
7	(B)(i) Malt or vinous beverages dispensed at the each tasting event
8	shall be from the inventory of the licensee or purchased from a wholesale
9	dealer.
10	(ii) A total of not more than 16 beverages may be offered at each
11	tasting event.
12	(C) A second-class licensee may be granted up to 48 <u>daily</u> tasting
13	permits per year. In addition, a second-class licensee may be granted up to
14	five daily permits per week to conduct a tasting as part of an educational food
15	preparation class or course conducted by the licensee on the licensee's
16	premises.
17	(D) An annual tasting permit shall permit a second-class licensee to
18	hold not more than five tasting events per week and a total of not more than
19	260 tasting events per year. An annual permit holder shall not be required to

provide the Division with advanced notice of any individual tasting events.

1	(2) A licensed manufacturer or rectifier of malt or vinous beverages <u>may</u>
2	be granted a daily tasting permit.
3	* * *
4	(3) A licensed wholesale dealer <u>may be granted a daily tasting permit</u> .
5	The permit authorizes a licensed wholesale dealer to dispense malt or vinous
6	beverages for promotional purposes at the wholesale dealer's premises without
7	charge to invited employees of first-, second-, and third-class licensees,
8	provided the invited employees are of legal age.
9	(c) A vinous beverage or malt beverage tasting event held pursuant to
10	subsection (b) of this section, not including an alcoholic beverage tasting
11	conducted on the premises of the manufacturer or rectifier, shall comply with
12	the following:
13	(1) continue for $\frac{1}{100}$ more than six hours, with $\frac{1}{100}$ more than $\frac{1}{100}$
14	16 beverages to be offered at a single event, and no not more than two ounces
