20	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to appropriate
21	\$750,000.00 to the Department of Health in fiscal year 2021 to provide grants

1	to emergency medical technician and paramedic training programs. It would
2	also authorize the Department to use up to \$750,000.00 annually for these
3	grants from the funds appropriated to the Department for emergency medical
4	personnel training. It would generate the revenue needed for the grants by
5	increasing the amount of the assessment on insurance companies for the Fire
6	Safety Special Fund.
7	An act relating to grants for emergency medical personnel training
8	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
9	Sec. 1. 18 V.S.A. § 906 is amended to read:
10	§ 906. EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES DIVISION;
11	RESPONSIBILITIES
12	To implement the policy of section 901 of this title, the Department of
13	Health shall be responsible for:

15	(6)(A) Training, or assisting in the training of, emergency medical
16	personnel, including using up to \$750,000.00 of the monies in the Emergency
17	Medical Services Fund established pursuant to section 908 of this chapter or
18	other monies appropriated to the Department for emergency medical personnel
19	training as follows:

1	(i) 50 percent shall be used for competitive grants to emergency
2	medical technician training programs based on documented regional and
3	multiagency support;
4	(ii) 25 percent shall be used to support the online, distance-
5	learning emergency medical technician training opportunities developed by the
6	Department pursuant to subsection 908(b) of this chapter and to support
7	partnerships with regional ambulance services to provide practical education
8	and skill development; and
9	(iii) 25 percent shall be used to provide tuition reimbursement

20	(a) The Emergency Medical Services Fund is established as a special fund
21	pursuant to 32 V.S.A. chapter 7, subchapter 5 comprising revenues received by

1	the Department from the Fire Safety Special Fund, pursuant to 32 V.S.A. §
2	8557(a), that are designated for this Special Fund; and public and private
3	sources, such as gifts, grants, and donations, together with additions and
4	interest accruing to the Fund. The Commissioner of Health shall administer
5	the Fund to the extent funds are available to support online and regional
