9	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to extend by two
10	years the required date by which coverage under a general permit shall be
11	sought for a discharge of stormwater from impervious surface of three or more
12	acres in size when the stormwater discharge previously was not permitted or
13	was permitted under an individual permit or general permit that did not
14	incorporate the requirements of the 2002 Stormwater Management Manual.
15	The bill also would grandfather discharges of stormwater from the requirement
16	to seek coverage under the three-acre permit if the discharge was previously
17	permitted, the current owner of the parcel from which the discharge originates
18	is the original listed permittee on the previously issued individual permit, and
19	the previously issued permit is current or has not expired.

7	(6) "Impervious surface" means those manmade surfaces, including
8	paved and unpaved roads, parking areas, roofs, driveways, and walkways, from
9	which precipitation runs off rather than infiltrates.

11	(14) "Stormwater runoff" means precipitation and snowmelt that does
12	not infiltrate into the soil, including material dissolved or suspended in it, but
13	does not include discharges from undisturbed natural terrain or wastes from
14	combined sewer overflows.

17	(1) The Secretary may issue general permits for classes of stormwater
18	runoff that shall be adopted and administered in accordance with the provisions

1	(3)(A) Within 120 days after the adoption by the Secretary of the rules
2	required under subsection (f) of this section, the The Secretary shall issue a
3	general permit under this section for discharges of stormwater from impervious
4	surface of three or more acres in size, when the stormwater discharge
5	previously was not permitted or was permitted under an individual permit or
6	general permit that did not incorporate the requirements of the 2002
7	Stormwater Management Manual or any subsequently adopted Stormwater
8	Management Manual. Under the general permit, the Secretary shall:
9	(A)(i) Establish a schedule for implementation of the general permit
10	by geographic area of the State. The schedule shall establish the date by which
11	an owner of impervious surface shall apply for coverage under this subdivision
12	(3). The Except as provided under subdivision (g)(3)(B) of this section, the
13	schedule established by the Secretary shall require an owner of impervious
14	surface subject to permitting under this subdivision $(3)$ to obtain coverage by
15	the following dates:
16	(i)(I) for impervious surface located within the Lake Champlain

6	originates from the parcel owner who is the original permitted to a new owner.
