1	(b) The database shall contain unique patient and provider identifiers and a
2	uniform coding system, and shall reflect all health care utilization, costs, and
3	resources in this State, and health care utilization and costs for services
4	provided to Vermont residents in another state.
5	(c)(1) Health insurers, health care providers, health care facilities, and
6	governmental agencies shall file reports, data, schedules, statistics, or other
7	information determined by the Board to be necessary to carry out the purposes
8	of this section. Such information may include:
9	(1)(A) health insurance claims and enrollment information used by
10	health insurers;
11	(2)(B) information relating to hospitals filed under subchapter 7 of this
12	chapter (hospital budget reviews); and
13	(3)(C) any other information relating to health care costs, prices, quality,
14	utilization, or resources required by the Board to be filed.
