12	(a) <u>Issuance of number plates.</u>
13	(1) A motor vehicle operated on any highway shall have displayed in a
14	conspicuous place either one or two number plates as the Upon initial
15	registration of a motor vehicle, the Commissioner may require shall furnish
16	one number plate, except that he or she shall furnish two number plates:
17	(A) for motor trucks with a registered weight of 10,100 pounds or
18	more; and
19	(B) when vanity or specialty plates are issued for an additional fee
20	pursuant to subsection 304(b) and sections 304b and 304c of this title.

1	(2) Registrants may obtain additional plates of the same design and
2	assigned number upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection 514(b) of
3	this title.
4	(b) Display of number plates. Such number plates shall be furnished by the
5	Commissioner and Number plates shall show the number assigned to such the
6	vehicle by the Commissioner and shall be conspicuously displayed as
7	prescribed by the Commissioner, but in no event shall the Commissioner
8	require that two number plates be displayed on any vehicle other than a motor
9	truck with a registered weight of 10,100 pounds or more.
10	(1) If only one number plate is furnished, the same displayed, it shall be
11	securely attached to the rear of the vehicle. If two <u>number plates</u> are furnished
12	displayed, one shall be securely attached to the rear and one to the front of the
13	vehicle.
14	(2) If a vehicle is only required to display one number plate, the
15	registrant may display on the front of the vehicle commemorative plates issued
16	under the former sections 515a, 515b, and 515c of this title; Vermont Strong
17	Plates; or any other plate the display of which is consistent with law. Nothing
18	in this section shall be construed to authorize the display of plates in violation
19	of section 513 of this title.
20	(3) The number plates shall be kept entirely unobscured, and the
21	numerals and the letters thereon shall be plainly legible at all times. They shall

1	be kept horizontal, shall be so fastened as not to swing, excepting however,
2	except that there may be installed on a motor truck or truck tractor a device
3	which that would, upon contact with a substantial object, permit the rear
4	number plate to swing toward the front of the vehicle, provided such device
5	automatically returns the number plate to its original rigid position after
6	contact is released, and the ground clearance of the lower edges thereof shall
7	be established by the Commissioner pursuant to the provisions of 3 V.S.A.
8	chapter 25.

3	(a) Except as provided in section 321 of this title, an owner of a motor
4	vehicle shall not attach or cause to be attached to the vehicle <u>a</u> number <u>plate or</u>
5	plates that were not assigned by the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles. A
6	person shall not operate a motor vehicle, except as provided in section 321 of
7	this title, to which <u>a</u> number <u>plate or</u> plates are attached that were not assigned
8	to the vehicle by the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles. An inspector of motor
