8	Subject: Health; cemeteries; preservation
9	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to: (1) establish
10	a work group to catalogue and propose remediation measures for Vermont
11	cemeteries at risk due to underlying environmental causes; and (2) create an
12	At-Risk Cemetery Fund to fund the remediation of cemeteries with
13	environmental damage or that are at risk of future damage due to underlying
14	environmental causes.
15	An act relating to protecting and remediating at-risk cemeteries

1	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
2	* * * Work Group for the Preservation of At-Risk Cemeteries * * *
3	Sec. 1. WORK GROUP FOR THE PRESERVATION OF AT-RISK
4	CEMETERIES; REPORT
5	(a) Creation. There is created a work group for the purpose of cataloguing
6	the number of Vermont cemeteries at risk due to underlying environmental
7	causes and estimating the funding necessary to stabilize these cemeteries.
8	(b) Membership. The Work Group shall be composed of the following
9	members:
10	(1) the State Archeologist, who shall serve as chair;
11	(2) the State Geologist;
12	(3) a representative of the Agency of Transportation's Cultural
13	Resources Division;
14	(4) a representative appointed by the Vermont Old Cemetery
15	Association;
16	(5) a representative appointed by the Vermont Cemetery Association;
17	<u>and</u>
18	(6) any other members deemed appropriate by the Chair.
19	(c) Powers and duties. The Work Group shall:
20	(1) conduct a statewide inventory of cemeteries that are at risk due to
21	underlying environmental causes;

1	(2) identify the underlying causes that put each cemetery listed on the
2	inventory at risk and generate potential remedies to stabilize and prevent the
3	future degradation of each listed cemetery;
4	(3) estimate the cost of stabilizing and preventing the future degradation
5	of each listed cemetery; and
6	(4) identify potential funding sources for the stabilization and prevention
7	of future degradation at each listed cemetery.
8	(d) Assistance. The Work Group shall have the administrative, technical,
9	and legal assistance of the Agency of Commerce and Community
10	Development.
11	(e) Report. On or before November 1, 2020, the Work Group shall submit
12	a written report to the General Assembly with its findings and any
13	recommendations for legislative action.
14	(f) Meetings.
15	(1) The Chair shall call the first meeting of the Work Group to occur on
16	or before August 1, 2020.
17	(2) A majority of the membership shall constitute a quorum.
18	(3) The Work Group shall cease to exist on January 1, 2021.
19	(g) Compensation and reimbursement. Members of the Work Group shall
20	be entitled to per diem compensation and reimbursement of expenses as
21	permitted under 32 V.S.A. § 1010 for not more than six meetings. These

1	payments shall be made from monies appropriated to the Agency of Commerce
2	and Community Development.
3	* * * Funding Cemetery Remediation * * *
4	Sec. 2. 18 V.S.A. § 5324 is added to read:
5	§ 5324. GRANTS FOR AT-RISK CEMETERIES
6	(a) The Vermont Old Cemetery Association (VOCA) shall provide grants
7	to an agency to remediate cemeteries with environmental damage or at risk of
8	future damage due to underlying environmental causes. As used in this
9	section, "environmental damage" and "risk of future damage due to underlying
10	environmental causes" mean existing or future damage to a cemetery due to
11	flooding, mudslides, fluvial or streambank erosion, or any other naturally
12	occurring forces.
13	(b) An agency shall:
14	(1) Report to VOCA, either verbally or in writing, the nature and extent
15	of environmental damage to the cemetery at issue or risk of future damage due
16	to underlying environmental causes.
17	(2) Provide written notice to the lot owner or next of kin if
18	environmental damage affected a crypt, niche, grave site, monument, or
19	memorial. The notice shall advise the lot owner or next of kin to seek
20	insurance benefits that may be available pursuant to a homeowner's insurance
21	policy. A copy of the notice shall be maintained by the agency.

1	(c) Within one year after reporting the nature and extent of environmental
2	damage or risk for future damage due to underlying environmental causes, the
3	agency may apply to VOCA for a grant to remediate the environmental
4	damage or stabilize cemeteries at risk of future damage due to underlying
5	environmental causes.
6	(1) The grant application shall include the following:
7	(A) a description of the environmental damage or areas at risk of
8	future damage due to underlying environmental causes and photographs of the
9	damage or areas at risk;
10	(B) a copy of any letters, newspaper advertisements, or other
11	documented attempts to obtain funding for the remediation from the family of
12	the deceased;
13	(C) a copy of other reports filed in accordance with law;
14	(D) a copy of bids submitted by at least two contractors for the cost
15	of remediation; and
16	(E) a notarized statement signed by the cemetery commissioner or
17	other proper officer that the agency has no available funds that it is authorized
18	to use for the purpose of remediation; that it has not been able to obtain
19	sufficient funds from the family of the deceased, including insurance benefits;
20	and that the proposed costs of the repairs are fair and reasonable.

1	(2) A VOCA representative shall review the environmental damage or
2	areas at risk of future damage due to underlying environmental causes within
3	120 days of receipt of a complete grant application and make a determination
4	based on the following factors:
5	(A) whether there is environmental damage or risk of future damage
6	due to underlying environmental causes;
7	(B) severity of the environmental damage or risk of future damage
8	due to underlying environmental causes;
9	(C) emotional distress to visiting families;
10	(D) appropriateness of prior use of payments from the At-Risk
11	Cemetery Fund;
12	(E) priority of application based upon previous allocations; and
13	(F) availability of monies within the At-Risk Cemetery Fund.
14	(3) Upon approval, the VOCA treasurer shall disburse funds directly to
15	the appropriate cemetery commissioner or other proper officer. The agency
16	shall apply all disbursements made by VOCA to the remediation efforts
17	described in the grant application. Any funds remaining after the remediation
18	has been performed must be returned to VOCA for redeposit to the At-Risk
19	Cemetery Fund.
20	(4) Within 120 days of receipt of disbursements, the agency shall make
21	a final report to VOCA. The final report shall include the remediation made

1	and by whom, the amount of funds expended, and the amount of funds to be
2	returned to VOCA, if any. If the remediation has not been completed, the
3	reason shall be explained, and the anticipated date for a subsequent, final
4	report shall be provided. The report and any additional report shall be sworn
5	by a cemetery commissioner or other proper officer.
6	Sec. 3. 18 V.S.A. § 5325 is added to read:
7	§ 5325. AT-RISK CEMETERY FUND
8	(a)(1) Creation. The At-Risk Cemetery Fund is established to provide
9	grants to remediate cemeteries with environmental damage or that are at risk or
10	future damage due to underlying environmental causes. As used in this
11	section, "environmental damage" and "risk of future damage due to underlying
12	environmental causes" mean the same as in section 5324 of this title.
13	(2) The Fund shall be administered by the Vermont Old Cemetery
14	Association (VOCA). Monies in the Fund shall be used solely to provide
15	grants to at-risk cemeteries, pursuant to section 5324 of this title.
16	(b)(1) Fees and collection. Every agency shall contribute \$5.00 to the At-
17	Risk Cemetery Fund for each burial or cremation it performs. A contribution
18	shall not be collected upon the burial of the remains of a deceased person
19	where a contribution was collected upon cremation.
20	(2) On or before January 15 of each year, every agency that has
21	performed a burial or cremation during the preceding calendar year shall

1	submit a check to VOCA for the total amount collected during the preceding
2	year toward payment to the Fund. Payment shall be accompanied by a
3	statement signed by a cemetery commissioner or other proper officer certifying
4	the number of burials and cremations and the amount transmitted. Funds will
5	be disbursed to VOCA on January 31 of each year.
6	Sec. 4. AT-RISK CEMETERY FUND; INITIAL FEE COLLECTION
7	The Vermont Old Cemetery Association shall collect initial fees for the At-
8	Risk Fund beginning on January 1, 2021 for each burial or cremation occurring
9	between July 1, 2020 and December 31, 2020.
