17	(a) In Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, in making up
18	specifications and advertising for bids on highway work, the board Board shall
19	fix, subject to local conditions, the minimum wage per hour for various classes

1	of labor and the minimum to be paid per hour or per cubic yard for trucks
2	which that the contractor shall be bound to pay.
3	(b) Each contract awarded by the Agency pursuant to this chapter for any
4	State project with a construction cost exceeding \$100,000.00 and that is not
5	supported in whole or in part by federal funds shall provide that all
6	construction employees working on the project shall be paid no less than the
7	mean prevailing wage published periodically by the Vermont Department of
8	Labor in its occupational employment and wage survey plus an additional
9	fringe benefit of 42 and one-half percent of wage, as calculated by the
10	Vermont prevailing wage survey. As used in this section, "fringe benefits"
11	means benefits, including paid vacations and holidays, sick leave, employer
12	contributions and reimbursements to health insurance and retirement benefits,
13	and similar benefits that are incidents of employment.
