7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require health
8	insurers to inform patients about their out-of-pocket exposure for the purchase
9	or lease of items of durable medical equipment (DME). It would require DME
10	providers to inform a patient whether it would be more cost-effective to
11	purchase a specific item of DME for cash rather than using insurance. The bill
12	would also prohibit health insurers from restricting the ability of DME
13	providers to disclose cost-sharing or cash price information to patients.

15	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

17	Subchapter 8. Durable Medical Equipment
18	§ 9481. DURABLE MEDICAL EQUIPMENT; COST TRANSPARENCY
19	(a) As used in this section, "durable medical equipment" means equipment,
20	such as a walker, wheelchair, or home oxygen equipment, that:

1	(1) can withstand repeated use;
2	(2) primarily and customarily serves a medical purpose;
3	(3) generally is not useful to an individual without an illness or injury;
4	<u>and</u>
5	(4) is appropriate for use in the home.
6	(b) A health insurer shall provide clear information to patients regarding
7	their out-of-pocket exposure for the purchase of items of durable medical
8	equipment.
9	(c)(1) A provider of durable medical equipment shall inform a patient
10	whether it would be more cost-effective for that patient to purchase a specific
11	item of durable medical insurance for cash rather than using insurance.
12	(2) A health insurer shall not prohibit or penalize a provider of durable
13	medical equipment for disclosing to an insured the cash price for an item of
14	durable medical equipment or for providing information to an insured
15	regarding the insured's cost-sharing amount for an item of durable medical
16	equipment.

18	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
