11	board operating a school lunch, breakfast, or summer meals program shall
12	submit to the Agency of Education an estimate of the percentage of locally
13	produced foods that were purchased by the school board for those programs.

3	(a) It is a goal of the State that by the year 2022 at least 20 percent of all
4	foods purchased for school lunch, breakfast, or summer meals programs shall
5	be locally produced foods. School boards have the discretion to define what
6	foods are included within the definition of "locally produced foods" for the
7	purposes of this subsection and subsection (b) of this section.
8	(b)(1) On or before December 31, 2020 and annually thereafter, a school
9	board operating a school lunch, breakfast, or summer meals program shall
10	submit to the Agency of Education an estimate of the percentage of locally
11	produced foods that were purchased by the school board for those programs
12	during the preceding school year or, for summer meal programs, during the
13	preceding summer.

10	percent of all foods purchased by the school board in the aggregate for school

14	or within 30 miles of the Vermont border or foods processed in Vermont with

16	(3) If a school district is eligible for a local foods incentive payment
17	under subdivision (2) of this subsection (c), then the Agency shall make the
18	incentive payment, subject to appropriation, which shall be determined as
19	follows:
20	(A) 15 cents per plate served through a school lunch program for

school districts purchasing at least 15 percent or more locally produced foods;

1	(B) 20 cents per plate served through a school lunch program for
2	school districts purchasing at least 20 percent or more locally produced foods;

4	(C) 25 cents per plate served through a school lunch program for
5	school districts purchasing at least 25 percent or more locally produced foods.
6	Sec. 4. ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT
7	(a) The Agency of Education shall collaborate with the Agency of
8	Agriculture, Fish and Wildlife to promote the local foods program under
9	16 V.S.A. § 1264a to school districts, farmers, food processors, and
10	distributors.
11	(b) The following position is created in the Agency of Education: one full-
12	time, classified position specializing in the administration of school food
13	programs to assist school districts with expanding access to locally produced
14	foods. The position established in this subsection shall be transferred and
15	converted from an existing vacant position in the Executive Branch of State
16	government. There is appropriated to the Agency of Education from the
17	General Fund for fiscal year 2021 the amount of \$100,000.00 for salary,
18	benefits, and operating expenses.

1	Sec. 5. APPROPRIATION FOR SUMMER FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM
2	There is appropriated to the Agency of Education from the General Fund
3	for fiscal year 2021 the amount of \$75,000.00 for the summer food service
4	program under 16 V.S.A. § 1264(a)(2).
5	Sec. 6. CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES
6	(a) It is a goal of the State that by the year 2023 at least 20 percent of all
7	foods purchased for meals served in correctional facilities shall be locally
8	produced foods. As used in this section, "locally produced foods" mean fruits,
9	vegetables, meat, poultry, dairy, and eggs that are grown or raised in Vermont
10	or within 30 miles of the Vermont border or foods processed in Vermont with
11	at least 75 percent Vermont-grown or-raised ingredients.
12	(b) On or before January 15, 2021 and annually thereafter, the Department
13	of Corrections shall report to the House Committees on Agriculture and
14	Forestry and on Corrections and Institutions and the Senate Committees on
15	Agriculture and on Institutions the estimated percentage of locally produced
16	foods purchased by correctional facilities during the previous fiscal year.
