16	§ 1107. CONSENT TO PREVENTATIVE SERVICES BY MINORS
17	(a) A minor 12 years of age or older may consent to medical care by a
18	licensed physician related to the prevention of a sexually transmitted disease,
19	including:

(1) receipt of an immunization for the prevention of Hepatitis B;

1	(2) receipt of an immunization for the prevention of the Human
2	papillomavirus (HPV);
3	(3) medications for pre- and post-exposure to the human
4	immunodeficiency virus (HIV); and
5	(4) any other services for the prevention of sexually transmitted
6	diseases.
7	(b) Consent under this section shall not be subject to disaffirmance due to
8	minority of the person consenting. The consent of the parent or legal guardian
9	of a minor consenting under this section shall not be necessary to authorize
10	care as described in this subsection.

12	(a)(1) If a minor 12 years of age or older is suspected to have a sexually
13	transmitted disease and the finding is verified by a licensed physician, the
14	minor may give his or her consent to medical treatment and hospitalization.
15	(2) Consent under this section shall not be subject to disaffirmance due
16	to minority of the person consenting. The consent of the parent or legal
17	guardian of a minor consenting under this section shall not be necessary to
18	authorize care as described in this subsection.

20	if the condition of a minor child requires immediate hospitalization for

7	substance use disorder, and the finding of such dependency, disease, or
8	alcoholism substance use disorder is verified by a licensed physician, the
9	minor may give:

6	Sec. 3. CONFORMING REVISION
7	When preparing the Vermont Statutes Annotated for publication, the Office
8	of Legislative Council shall make the following revisions throughout the
9	statutes as needed for consistency with Sec. 1 of this act, provided the revisions
10	have no effect on the meaning of the affected statutes:
11	(1) replace "venereal disease" with "sexually transmitted disease"; and
