Rep. Donahue of Northfield explained her vote as follows:

"Madam Speaker:

We are in an extraordinary time, where safety requires that we avoid coming together as a group, and yet, we cannot simply suspend our responsibilities. Despite its flaws in allowing us to fully meet our obligations for representation, we must do what we can to make a remote system serve its functions in order to move emergency responses forward and to maintain government functions, during the time that we have declared a state of emergency resulting from this pandemic. I thank the Speaker for her leadership in helping us chart this balance."

Senate Proposal of Amendment Concurred in

H. 741

The Senate proposed to the House to amend House bill, entitled

An act relating to criminal record checks on contractors working in Stateowned or -leased facilities

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The Senate proposes to the House to amend the bill as follows:

<u>First</u>: In Sec. 2, 20 V.S.A. § 2056i, by striking out subsection (e) in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

(e) Process for sending information. The Commissioner may inform the contractor in writing of the approved level of access granted for each person for which a record was obtained, but shall not reveal the content of the record to the contractor.

Second: In Sec. 2, 20 V.S.A. § 2056i, by striking out subsection (h) in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

(h) Confidentiality. Criminal records and criminal record information received under this section are designated confidential unless, under subsection (e) of this section, or State or federal law or regulation, the record or information may be disclosed to specifically designated persons.

<u>Third</u>: In Sec. 3, Effective Date, by striking out the following: "July 1, 2020" and inserting in lieu thereof the word passage
